Remember, the soldier boys like berries, cherries, plums, prunes, pears and apples better fresh from the cans than they do the old dried stuff as Captain Branson said the other evening, with the live noodles between the layers.

Remember, we are not asking you to donate these things free, but will pay you the market price and will appreciate your patronage as well. The girl or boy with a basket full of cherries or beans will get his or her turn at the platform the same as the man with his truck load.

**STRAWBERRIES TO BE HIGH THIS SEASON**

From present indications the price of strawberries will be almost prohibitive this summer for home canning, and to eaters of them while they are fresh, the taste will be like that of eating half dollars at every sitting.

The canneries and packing plants are already making their offers for this year's crop, which will prevail in the markets also. The Home Packing company is trying to make contracts with growers and will take all the strawberries that are offered in any quantity at 8 cents a pound.

Other berries will also be up and a-coming on price. Eight cents will be paid for red raspberries, and the price of Logans and Evergreens will be five cents.

Strange to say, there is no present call for cherries. Perhaps there will be before the season goes very far, but at present it looks as if cherries were going to be cheap, especially if there is a good crop.

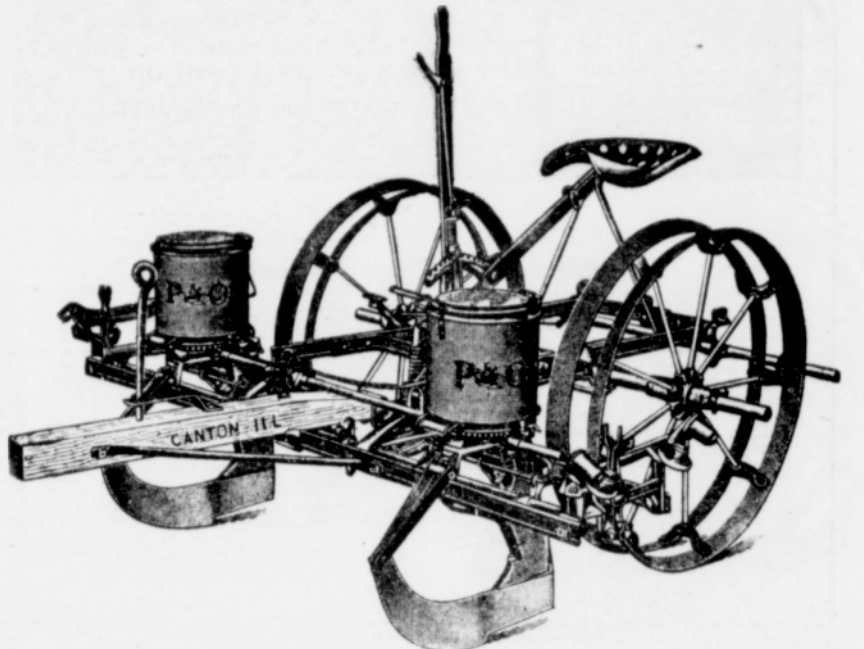
G. W. Wonacott, Geo. Knieriem and N. L. Smith left yesterday morning for Albany, Oregon to attend the state G. A. R. encampment.
