GUN SHOTS THROUGH THE AIRPLANE BLADES

The Browning machine gun has successfully undergone a test to determine its value for use with aircraft. This is one of three types of machine guns with which the rate of fire can be so synchronized with the revolutions of the propeller of a tractor airplane that the gun can be fired by the pilot of a combat plane through the revolving blades.

Airplane propellers revolve at from 800 to 200 revolutions per minute. The machine gun is connected with the airplane engine by a mechanical or hydraulic device, and impulses from the crank shaft are transmitted to the machine gun. The rate of fire of the machine gun is constant and its fire is synchronized with the revolving propeller blades by "wasting" a certain percentage of the impulses it receives from the airplane engine and by having the remaining impulses trip or pull the trigger so that the gun fires just at the fraction of the second when the propeller blades are clear of the line of fire.

The pilot operates the gun by means of a lever which controls the circuit and allows the impulses to trip the trigger.

MEN FROM COUNTRY MAY GET ON FORCE

The city of Portland needs capable men for its police force and men residing outside of Portland have been invited to take the entrance examination on Tuesday, June 25, 1918. The examination will be held by the Civil Service Board at the City Hall in Portland.

The subjects of the examination and relative weights of subjects on a scale of 100 are as follows: Experience and fitness 15, practical questions 25, penmanship 5, arithmetic 5, spelling 5, fire arms efficiency 15, oral examination 30.

Police officers are paid \$100 monthly upon appointment and are given an increase of \$10 at the end of the first six months, \$5 at the end of the second six months, \$10 at the end of the second year. Thereafter \$125 per month.

The opportunity for advancement in the police bureau is excellent for men who prove themselves capable and faithful officers.

Men seeking appointment on the police force must be American citizens between the ages of 25 and 48 years and must pass the physical test prescribed by the Civil Service Board before taking the written examination.

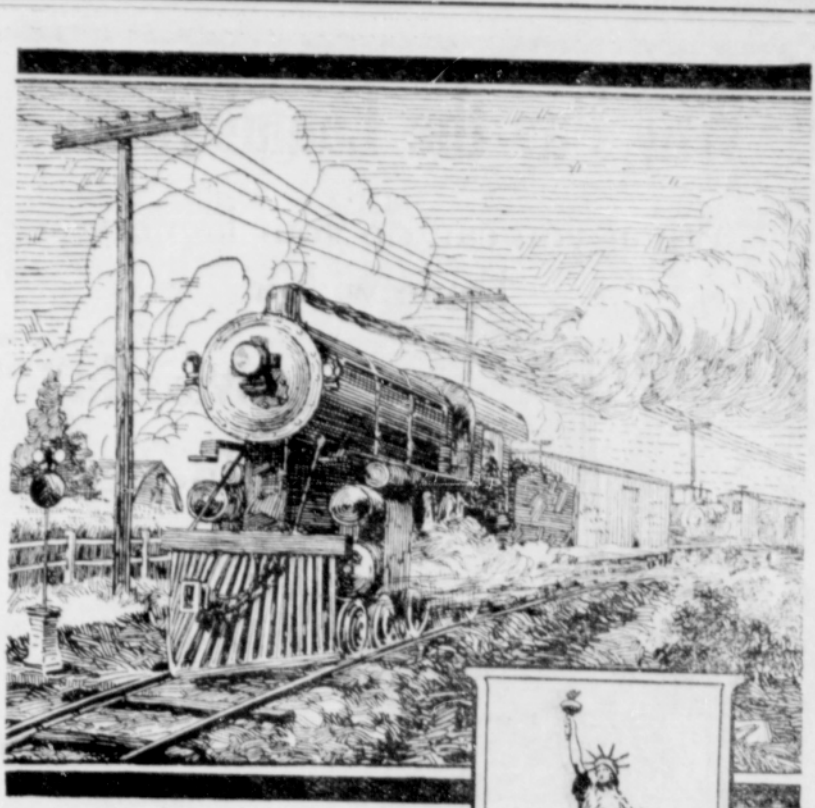
