subjects and formulate the method of conducting discussions.

(3) To provide and conduct games, dances, community dramas, musicals, motion pictures, and to promote all similar play activities with a view to increasing the joy, health and good fellowship among both adults and youths.

(4) To provide courses of studies for young men and women as a preparation for citizenship and devise methods of organizing the youth into voluntary, cooperative and constructive forms of patriotic service.

(5) To promote closer cooperation between the school and the home, between parents and teachers; to aim to improve the school equipment; to secure more adequate support and better housing conditions for teachers; to endeavor to provide ways and means or to remove such obstacles as may be necessary to enable all children to remain in school until they have finished the grammar grades.

(6) To organize and conduct a school savings bank.

They shall visit their schools from time to time, assist the teachers in maintaining discipline and when necessary may exclude refractory pupils therefrom subject to further action by the county board of education.

On or before the first Monday in October they shall submit to the county board of education an estimate of whatever may be required for the conduct of the school for the ensuing year. They shall include with this estimate any suggestions for the improvement of the school or the environment thereof.

Section 10. The powers and duties of county school superintendents in counties coming under the provisions of this act shall be as follows:

(1) To act as the executive officer of the county board of education, and to execute, either in person or through subordinates, all educational policies decided upon by it.

(2) To act as the chief educational officer in the county, and as the representative of the state educational authorities. To this end he shall see that the school laws of the state and the rules and regulations of the State Board of Education are carried out.

(3) To have supervisory control of all schools and libraries under the county board of education, and general supervisory control of all officers in its employ, with power to outline, direct and coordinate their work, and, for cause, to recommend their dismissal.

(4) To nominate for election, and when elected to assign, transfer, and suspend all teachers and principals, and, for cause, recommend the promotion or dismissal of such.

(5) To visit the schools of the county, to advise and assist teachers and principals, to hold teachers' meetings and institutes, to direct the reading circle work in the county, and to labor in every practicable way to improve educational conditions within his county.

(6) To act as the agent for the State Department of Education in the examining and certification of teachers, and to decide, upon appeal to him, all disputes arising within the county as to the interpretation of the school law or the powers and duties of school officers.

(7) To oversee the preparation of the courses of study and to approve the same, to study the educational work done in the schools, and to approve for purchase all text and supplemental books and all apparatus and supplies.

(8) To recommend changes in the distribution or the organization of the schools, to recommend the establishment of new schools or branch libraries, and to assist in the correlation of the work of the schools with that of the libraries, agricultural activities, and other forms of educational service.

(9) To act as secretary of the County Board of Education and to have charge of the clerical, statistical and financial work connected with the administration of the schools of the county school district. He is to approve all warrants drawn on the funds of the county, and to prepare the financial and statistical portions of the required annual school report.

(10) To have general charge of all purchases of supplies for the schools and the distribution of the same, and to have general oversight of all janitor service and repair work, except as otherwise provided for by the county board of education.

(11) To be custodian of all legal papers belonging to the county school district; to give all required notices, administer oaths; sign contracts as directed by the board; register all teachers' certificates; distribute blank forms and collect and tabulate the statistical returns; keep a complete set of books covering all financial transactions and all funds; and perform such other clerical and statistical functions as he may be directed to do.

annual printed report showing the work, progress, and needs of the schools of the county.

Section 11. All Acts and parts of Acts in conflict herewith are hereby repealed; provided, however, that all general laws of this state relating to public schools shall be applicable to districts under this Act except insofar as the same may be in conflict with the provisions hereof.

26th. Add another section to the act, to read as follows:

"Section 12. Within a reasonable time and as promptly as convenient after this act takes effect, a regular or special school election shall be held in each of the school districts of the county, or counties, affected hereby, and at such election there shall be submitted to the legal voters of such county the question of whether or not such county shall come under the provisions of this act, and unless and until a majority of the legal voters voting at such election, shall vote in favor of such county coming under the provisions of this act, the provisions hereof shall not become effective so as

to create a county school district as herein provided for, but if at such election a majority of the legal voters voting upon the question shall vote in favor of coming under the provisions of this act, then and in that event all of the terms and provisions of this act, shall immediately be and become in full force and effect."
