EXEMPTIONS ALLOWED UNDER NARCOTIC LAW

Under the provisions of the original Harrison Narcotic Law, remedies or preparations which contain not more than two grains of opium, or one-fourth grain of morphine, or one-fourth grain of heroin, or one grain of codeine to the ounce, are exempt.

Many merchants in Oregon, other than retail druggists, carry such preparations and they should immediately apply to Milton A. Miller, Collector of Internal Revenue at Portland for the necessary blanks to register.

The tax is payable not later than April 25th, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1919.
