

The following states have ratified the suffrage amendment: Illinois, Wisconsin, Michigan, Kansas, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, Texas, Iowa, Missouri, Arkansas, Montana, Nebraska, Minnesota, New Hampshire, Utah and California. Alabama refused to ratify. Eighteen more states are needed to carry the amendment.

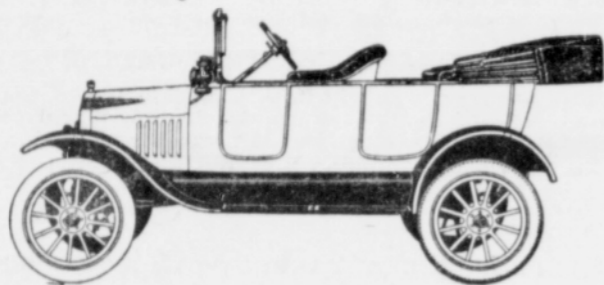

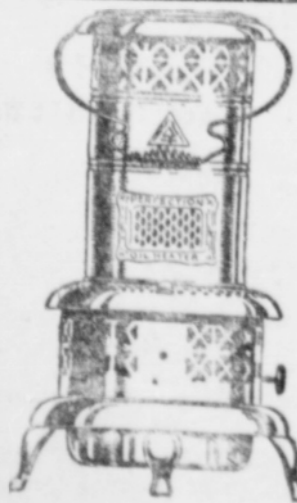
