Deterioration of Bordeaux Eliminated

By the addition of sugar at the rate of one-eighth ounce to every pound of copper sulphate used in the preparation of Bordeaux mixture, the usual deterioration and changing to purple together with heavy sediment is effectively done away with and the rate of settling greatly reduced. This was proved by a series of experiments conducted by the botany department of the college.

"This means that a whole or partial tankful can be held over night or for an indefinite period if the sugar is added, with no fear of undesirable changes taking place," says W. A. Smart, spray investigator in the Oregon Agricultural Experiment station. "At the winter strength 6-6-50 for a 200 gallon tank 3 ounces of sugar is required—seven teaspoonfuls. Care should be taken not to put a larger amount of sugar than this into the solution as the suspensibility is not increased and the copper of the mixture is put into solution which is likely to cause damage to the trees.

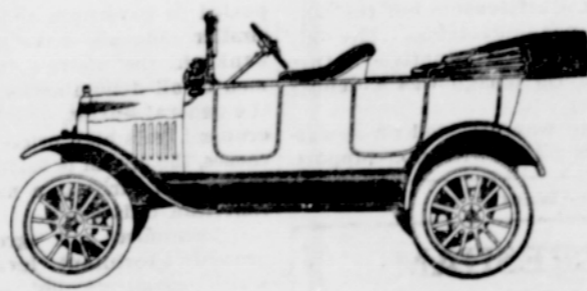
