**STOLEN THUNDER.**

The open season for political gunning is upon us. Every aspirant should watch his tongue and keep it bridled. If he ever wishes to say that somebody has paroled his pet phrases, let him count ten and a hundred tens if necessary in order to keep it unuttered.

**How to Improve Fair**

 stimulate to greater development and increased output. The tittering city girl who blushes when she discovers the broods of pigs taking an afternoon lunch ala naturale, and her masculine escort who wonders because a young female fowl is called a pullet, if a real young heifer is called a bullet? Yes, there are lots of them and they need educating. Anything that is going to engender the call-of-the-soil spirit to the blase city man is educational, for that man hopes some day to own a whole herd of those big black and white cows with udders like bushel baskets and his wife has visions of some day harvesting Leghorn eggs from the haymow at 60 cents per dozen. Such a fair is a constant education to the real farmer and the reader the more susceptible he is to that education.

"But how can a fair promoter expect to attract strong exhibits and competition with a prize of six-bits or a dollar-and-a-half offered for the best bushel of grain, the finest pedigree pullet, or the best box of prunes, when a bunch of rangey, second class race horses are presented with a purse of from one to two hundred times that much for a few minutes' performance?"

"Hang up a few prizes of fifty or a hundred dollars each, with proportionate second and third prizes for the best exhibits in those lines of agriculture, poultry and livestock, which are really worth while and worthy of stimulation, and see how the exhibitors will jump to compete. Quit offering just as much for a shirred edged petunia or a short-haired Mexican cactus hound as is offered for the best dairy cow, fattest Duroc, handsomest Rhode Island fowl or the best exhibit of corn, alfalfa, wheat, apples, milk goats and similar important products of this state."

"Why offer as much in prize money for a coop of those freak Hamburg fowls, that look like a cross between a disappointed chrysanthemum, a tubercular jacksnipe and a drunken man's vision of a sunset over Mt. Hood, as is offered for an exhibit of real commercial poultry, such as Orpingtons, Leghorns, Barred Rocks and other honest-to-goodness egg producers?"

Don't forget to feed the birds.
