A SCHOOL PROGRAM FOR THE LITTLE TOWN.

The insistence of this book upon the essential identity of the interests of the small centre and open country, enables it enthusiastically to agree that the town high school should have its ample garden plots, its orchard, barns and stock, and if possible, its small farm.

"These people stand the best chance possible of carrying out this program," said George W. Kable, county agent. "They are earnest and have every facility and incentive for completing the work."

"The spirit of cooperation shown by Alsea people is the best I have yet seen," said Prof. E. B. Fitts, O. A. C. dairy field worker.

The work was organized under the auspices of the farm bureau, with community leaders in charge of each project. Paul V. Maris, state leader of county agent work, says of the program: "I have every confidence that this progressive program will succeed."

The carrying out of these farm bureau projects trains farmers in cooperative work, and when this effect is multiplied as it is in more than 200 other Oregon communities the importance of farm bureau work in this state begins to appear.

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OREGON COMMUNITY ADOPTS NEW PLAN

Fifteen big improvement projects have been adopted by the hustling little mountain valley district of Alsea, Benton county, as follows for the year 1920:

Purchase of 20 registered cows. Cooperative purchase of a \$1,000 Jersey bull.

Milk weighing and testing by Alsea high school boys to weed out loafer cows.

Cooperative shipment of "beef" dairy cows. Add 50 acres to corn area.

Record irrigation profits. Put agriculture into the high school, with state and federal aid.

Organize boys' and girls' pig clubs. Erect ten new silos.

Graduate gray diggers. Help boys and girls trap 1,000 moles. Child welfare and feeding, by women.

Study of balanced meals and home conveniences. Improve clothing styles.

Exhibit year's achievements in community fair.

TAX COLLECTOR MILLER WARNS INCOME PAYERS

A word of warning to income taxpayers is contained in a statement given out today by Internal Revenue Collector Milton A. Miller who points out that returns must show all items of taxable income for 1919.

Guesswork, estimates, and other hit-or-miss tactics are barred when a person is making out his income tax return. Accuracy and completeness must be insisted upon.

Salaried persons and wage-earners must not confine their returns to figures showing a year's pay at so much a day or so much a week. The actual amount drawn should be ascertained and reported.

Income Not Always Cash. It must be borne in mind that compensation may be paid in other forms than in cash. A bonus paid in Liberty Bonds is taxable at the market value of the bonds.

Premiums paid by an employer for life or other insurance in favor of employees is additional compensation to the employees.

The Income Tax does not apply to amounts received under accident and health insurance, or under workmen's compensation laws; and damages recovered by suit or settlement for injuries or sickness is also exempt.

Tips received by waiters, porters and others are taxable income for such donations are in recognition of services and are not gifts.
