**SANE AND CONSTRUCTIVE.**

It is often said, that nothing new can be said of Abraham Lincoln. On the contrary he is new always. His life presents new characteristics, suggests new thoughts as each anniversary of his birth arrives. He was great not so much because of his intellectual power as because of his moral power. He was politically strong because the people trusted him and believed in his Americanism.

True greatness is modest always. It was so with Lincoln to a marked degree. Never was he an egotist. Never did he trust to his own human powers to accomplish great deeds. He rested securely on a power beyond human effort—a power which rules the destiny of men and of nations.

In these crucial times, not only for America but for all the world, nations and leaders can learn a lesson from the life of Lincoln—a lesson never to be forgotten. He believed that this nation, and every nation destined to endure, must be in harmony with the great forces of righteousness, sane liberty and constructive freedom—all working to uphold the national structure.

As a party under Lincoln arose to save the Union from division and destruction, so the same party, inspired by the same lofty spirit, stands on guard against the perils of internationalism and the evils of radical Socialism masquerading as the "new freedom" or the "new democracy."

"Intelligence, patriotism, Christianity, and a firm reliance on Him who has never yet forsaken this favored land are still competent to adjust in the best way all our present difficulties," said Lincoln.

"Your committee recommends that prayers be offered in all our churches for the suffering children throughout the world, especially those who are in distress and peril as the result of the war."

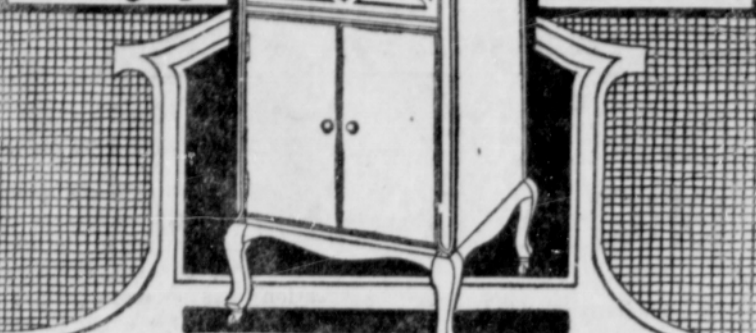
