Senator Harding a Printer's Devil.

It has been said that every man who has achieved distinction and glory owes it to the inspiration of some woman. This, doubtless, is true in the case of Senator Warren G. Harding of Ohio, who is now an aspirant to the United States presidency.

During a recent campaign trip through Texas Mrs. Harding spoke of these early days of trial and struggle.

"Pennies were scarce in those days," Mrs. Harding said with a reminiscent smile, "but we were—and ever have been—very happy. It was the Senator's desire to own a newspaper. And I think the most momentous day in our lives was that day when he purchased the Marion Star."

In speaking of her own ambitions along journalistic lines, Mrs. Harding said: "I liked to write and the girls always wanted me to write up their weddings because they did not recognize themselves in print. I visualized and idealized, perhaps. While I did not actually stay in the office I knew all ins and outs. Senator Harding started in as a 'devil' in the printing office. Of all people in the world I am most keenly interested in newspaper folk, especially the girls. I understand how often they are misunderstood, but I know what a tremendous power they are."

Overland 4 Sets a Great Endurance Mark

Driven continuously for seven days and seven nights, over ordinary suburban roadways, an Overland 4 stock car has established at Indianapolis, Ind., a new unofficial world's mileage record for a light car under 168 hours of incessant driving.

The Overland 4 in the seven days and nights of this remarkable endurance run piled up record of 5,452.15 miles. The car finished the grind on the same Pisk tires with which it started. To make this new record, the drivers of Overland 4 maintained an average speed of 32 1/2 miles an hour, 24 hours a day. Gasoline mileage was 20.24 miles a gallon.

The consistency of Overland 4 performance is shown in this tabulation of each day's run. The first day and night, the speedometer registered 749 miles. On the second day, the mark was 778 miles; on the third, 747 miles; on the fourth, 793; fifth, 809; sixth, 823, and on the last lap of this new unofficial world's record, 753 miles.

The test, the first of its kind to be tried and actually accomplished by a light car, started at 9 a. m. on February 25th and ended at 9 a. m. on March 3d. The run was conducted by the Gibson Company of Indianapolis, distributors for Overland cars. The mileage and gasoline records are certified by the following observers:

Howard F. (Howdy) Wilcox, winner of the 1919 Indianapolis Speedway 500 mile racing classic; Munroe E. Boblet, secretary of the Hoosier Motor club of Indianapolis; and R. H. Serogin, editor of the Hoosier Motorist.

Officials of the company witnessed the start and the finish of the seven-day continuous-day run. Careful examination of the car and its power plant after the run convinced the Gibson company that the car was ready to repeat the endurance test of the 168 hours of furious driving and largely because the car had been protected by the new Triplex springs. The run is considered the highest possible verification of the ability of this new spring suspension to protect the car from road wear and provide big car riding comfort in a motor car of short wheel-base.
