**TWO-MILL TAX FOR RURAL SCHOOLS.**

In a recent communication from an Orient subscriber the question is asked if their is a joker in the 2-mill tax for rural schools. In Mr. Alderson's statements before the Orient school patrons at a recent meeting he made the statement that the Orient district would pay a tax of \$1300 on their assessed valuation of \$650,000 while they would draw back \$2800 from the fund.

The tax is to be assessed on all property in the state and each county is to receive back all of the money raised by the tax. This money will be distributed among the schools according to the number of teachers employed and not according to valuation of the district or according to the children.

In Multnomah according to present figures this will mean \$650 per teacher. Orient being a district of \$650,000 valuation will pay a tax of \$1300 and will receive back \$650 for each teacher or for their four teachers \$2600.

Orient being a joint district we are not prepared to say what the exact amount would be as it would receive tax money from both Multnomah and Clackamas counties which would perhaps account for the extra \$200 or perhaps there was a misunderstanding of the figures. We have never heard what the amount per teacher would be for Clackamas county.

According to our understanding of the bill the amount per teacher will vary in the different districts as the amount from the 2-mill tax in the county would be divided among the schools according to the number of teachers they employed.

The object is to equalize the tax so that the district with a high valuation and few pupils will help provide for the district with a low valuation and a large number of pupils to provide for.

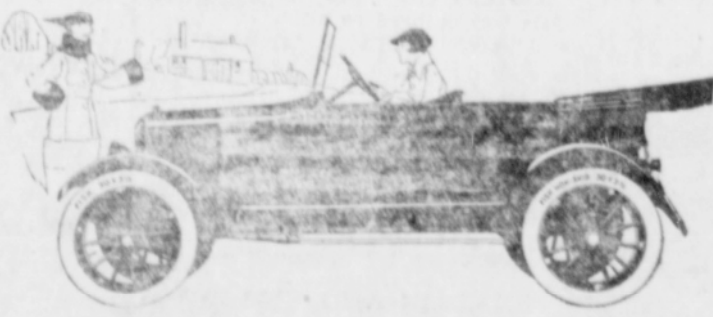
