**Non-Partisan League.**  
 Shall we have it in Oregon? Whether you think it is good thing or not you should hear Walter Pierce and Arthur Foster at the Masonic hall, Gresham, Saturday night, May 1, at 8 o'clock. They will discuss this vital question so you will understand it. Mr. Foster is of North Dakota and is perfectly familiar with the workings of the league in that state.

This is a vital issue. A propaganda is being started to win Oregon to the league ranks. Oregon is thought to be a fertile field. It is easy to initiate freak legislation. There is need of being informed on this question.

**FRED G BUCHTEL IS UP FOR RE-ELECTION**

"If re-elected I will continue to administer the commission's affairs on a sound basis, and as economically as is consistent with the public welfare," says Fred G. Buchtel in his declaration of candidacy for the republican nomination for public service commission.

Mr. Buchtel was elected in 1916 on a progressive platform of business principles, and is seeking re-election for a second term on his record.

"I will aggressively continue my efforts to secure an ample allocation of them, for Oregon industries and lumber shippers," he continues. "I will strive, as in the past, to protect and advance the state's interests. Merit and efficiency will be my only consideration in employing the commission's staff and justice will be my guide in the adjustment of the rates and service of all utilities and railroads."

Among the achievements of Mr. Buchtel's administration are the adjustment of apple rates, resulting in a saving of more than a quarter of a million dollars to the fruit industry; a reduction of the rates on road building materials, netting a saving to the state in its road building program of more than \$100,000; and the elimination of many dangerous grade crossings and campaign to minimize traffic hazards.

Mr. Buchtel's activities for more cars for Oregon's industries and lumber shippers brought beneficial results and the recent victory for the people in the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company case resulted not only in a marked reduction of the Burlington telephone rates and the elimination of toll charges at many points, but in a refund of approximately \$150,000 to patrons of the company.

In addition to regulating rates and service of public utilities and railroads the Public Service Commission administers the grain inspection department of the state, and Mr. Buchtel's work in connection with this, has been on a par with his administration generally as Public Service Commissioner.
