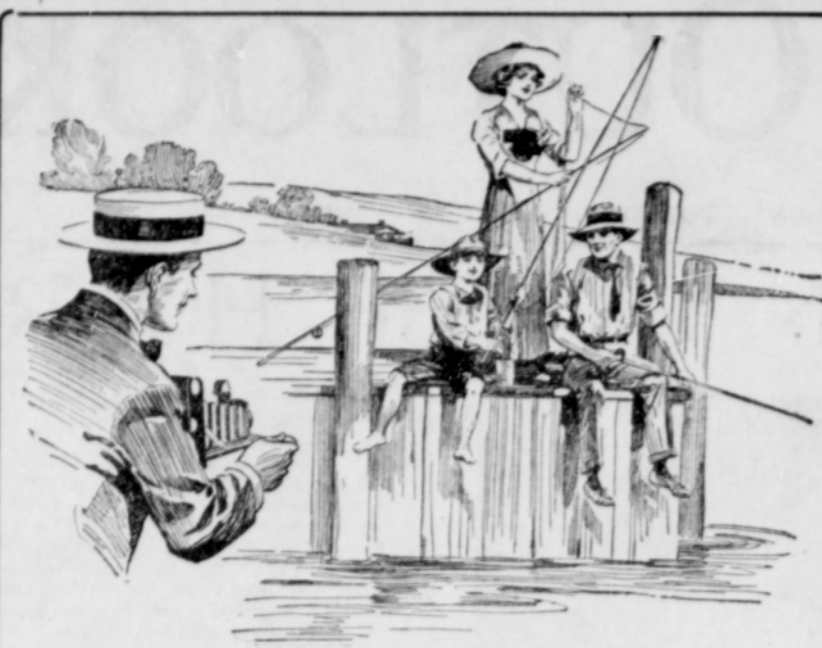

When it became known that the Outlook, on its own initiative, was planning to make one of its regular issues a Lowden booster there came offers of assistance on all sides. Many offered to contribute articles. But owing to the limitations of space not all could be used in this issue.

As a practical illustration of what good government means it is officially estimated that Illinois will have a cash balance of \$9,877,225 on hand July 1, 1920, in spite of a reduction of 33 per cent in the tax rate. This is what Governor Lowden's business administration has done for Illinois.

Oregon is normally republican. Oregon voters are intelligent and careful. They have been educated to vote for the man they want. They are not to be stampeded by any merely political influence or pressure or secondary interests. Oregon could well be proud to go on record as supporting a man of Lowden's type for president.

If real ability, wide experience in state and government and large business affairs and genuine broad-minded, unflinching patriotism, are the considerations which dominate the minds and hearts of Oregon's voters on May 21 there will be no doubt about the result—Oregon for Lowden; Lowden for President.

The amount of publicity matter, especially pertaining to presidential candidates, sent out through the mails is almost inconceivable. No wonder there is a shortage of paper for ordinary uses. The Outlook literally has stacks of it, some of very elaborate and extravagant character. It all has the very careful scrutiny of the editorial department. Information is gained that may some day be useful—if not right now.

The Outlook claims the distinction of being the first newspaper in Oregon to carry on its front page a Lowden headed article. The article signed by Milo C. King was written and published on Armistice day, November 11, 1919, and was headed, "Make Lowden safe for the Presidency." The letter was inspired by the fact that Governor Lowden had recently been announced as presidential timber and Mr. King remembered him as a fellow graduate of the Iowa State University.
