**FRANK J. VAN QUALIFIES AS SHARPSHOOTER**

By hitting the bull's-eye from the standing, sitting and kneeling positions, Private Frank J. Van of Gresham has qualified as a sharpshooter in the U. S. Marine Corps, according to an official report from headquarters at Washington, D. C.

Private Van is a son of Mrs. Addie Dunn of Gresham, and he enlisted in the Marine Corps on October 1, 1914 at Portland. At present he is stationed in Portland on recruiting duty. During recent trials on the rifle range he demonstrated his proficiency, and hereafter will wear the sharpshooter's medal and will receive an increase in pay.

The Marine won high honors at the National Rifle matches at Caldwell, N. J., last summer, winning a majority of events. Riflemen are now being selected to take part in the Olympic games to be held at Antwerp, Belgium, during the coming summer and for the National Rifle matches to be fired at Camp Perry, Ohio, next August.

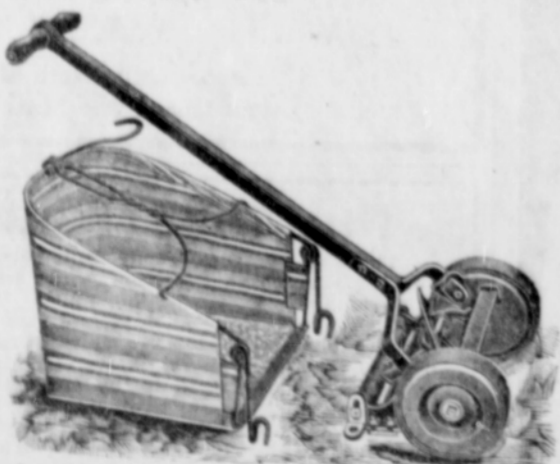

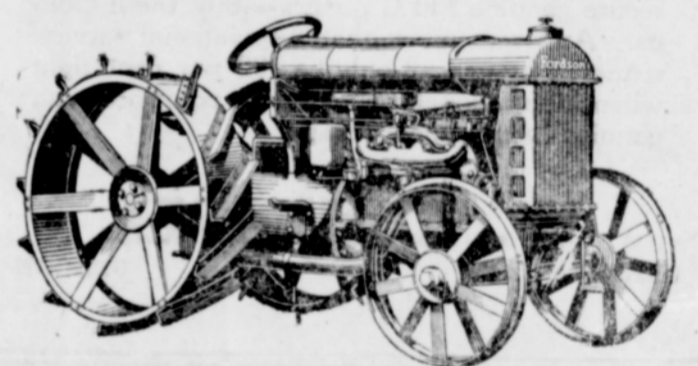
