GASOLINE SHORTAGE ANNOYS. According to reports a movement has been started in Oregon City to get refund of auto license fees on the ground that the gasoline shortage makes cars practically useless.

It is not likely, however, that any refund can reasonably be asked for on this account. It is an unforeseen condition for which the secretary of state's office is not responsible.

REASONS FOR SHORTAGE. To the average person the reasons given for the shortage of gasoline are vague and indefinite and fail to satisfy.

It is stated on good authority that Oregon is getting a larger supply of gasoline at present than ever before. Hence the shortage must be due to greatly increased demand.

Oregon's peculiar law requiring a certain specific gravity test for gasoline has been suspended and hence cannot any longer be used as an excuse for the shortage.

The oil companies are probably making an honest endeavor to furnish Oregon its due share of this much needed commodity but if the truth were fairly considered it would probably appear that the price has something to do with the local shortage.

The Standard Oil company of California is installing a large refinery in California where a new process will be used for breaking up the crude oil which will yield ten or twelve per cent increase per barrel.

It is also claimed that the use of crude oil is being discouraged both by a considerable increase in price and lack of market supply.

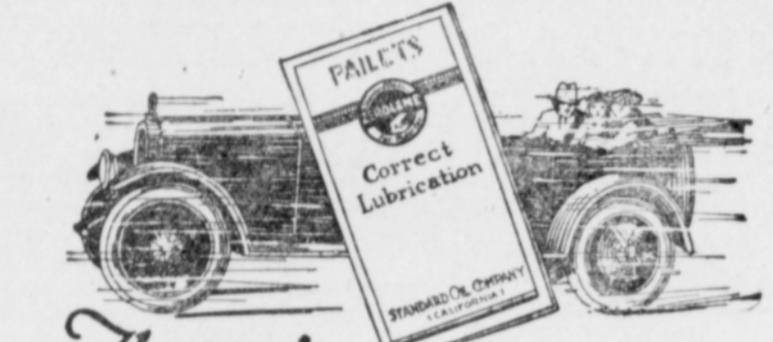

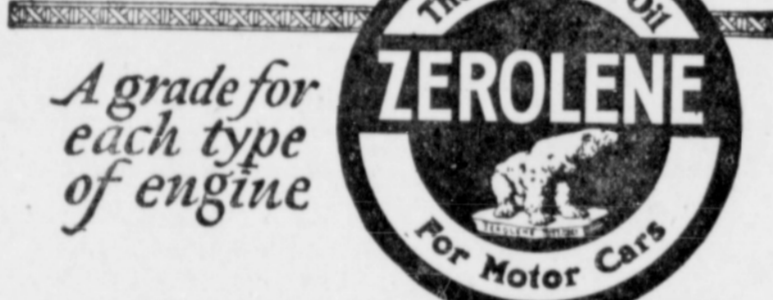
