RUBBER SOLED SHOES CREATING BIG DEMAND

The rubber companies report for the current year such an enormous increase in the demand for fabric shoe with rubber soles that their factories with a stimulated production greater than ever before are unable to cope with their orders. This great increase in business of this character is due to the improvement in style and quality and due also to the extreme cheapness of the product as compared with leather footwear.

One bit of fiction that has gained wide circulation is that rubber sole shoes hurt the eyes. Where this fairy tale originated is doubtful, but it has persisted for many years. After exhaustive investigation it has been proved that there is no basis of truth for a thought of this kind.

Another stock argument that rubber sole shoes burn and draw the feet has been discounted. In the better grades of shoes of this kind a heavy fibre inner sole is used with a ground cork filling between the inner sole and the outer sole, thus giving the same protection against burning as is found in the best made leather shoes. In the other grades a heavy felt or fabric combination inner sole is used.

Because its old plant was unable to accommodate its business the United Manufacturing company of Portland, which makes mattresses, bed springs and comforters, has moved to a new building. This factory has 65,000 feet of floor space and is well equipped with additional machinery.

NOTICE OF MEETING OF COUNTY BOARD OF EQUALIZATION

Notice is hereby given that on Monday, September 13, 1920, the Board of Equalization of Multnomah County will attend at the office of the County Assessor, at the Courthouse in Portland, and publicly examine the assessment rolls for the year 1920, and correct all errors in valuation, description or qualities of lands, lots or other property, assessed by the County Assessor. And it shall be the duty of persons interested to appear at the time and place appointed. If it shall appear to such Board of Equalization that there are any lands or lots or other property assessed twice, or incorrectly assessed as to description or quantity, and in the name of a person or persons not the owner thereof, or assessed under or beyond the actual cash value thereof, said Board may make proper correction of the same. If it shall appear to such Board that any land, lots or other property assessable by the Assessor are not assessed, such Board shall assess the same at the full cash value thereof.
