THE 19TH AMENDMENT.

The action of Secretary of State Colby in signing the women's suffrage amendment yesterday ended the long fight for equal franchise which has been carried on for fifty years and which knew no defeat.

"The seal of the United States has been duly affixed to the certificate and the suffrage amendment is now the 19th amendment to the constitution," Secretary Colby announced.

The fight has been watched with special interest in states where women have had the vote for many years. It is unthinkable that any of them would return to the old plan of male suffrage. The 19th amendment will stand.

"Senator Harding is one of the most lovable men in American public life today," says Ned Baldwin who knows him well. "He will bring back to the country an era of good feeling like that of Monroe and McKinley. Not all of our most brilliant presidents have had that human touch which we think of first in Lincoln, McKinley and Teddy Roosevelt. Senator Harding impressed me as one who would bring back that humaneness to the White House. He does not isolate himself on an imaginary peak of perfection but lives a mental life down with us common folks. The heart of the people and their president can only throb in unison when the president loves his country more than he does his own advancement to a greater power. You cannot see Harding smile and keep your own good will from going out to him. He loves America and its institutions with the intensity of a devotee. I am for him first of all because I believe that if he is president for the next four years it will preserve our republic and save us from the perilous drift toward autocracy, so lately grown dangerous."

For the first time in many years a vessel flying the Swedish flag put in at the Portland harbor a few days ago. She was the steamer Indus, which is to load a full cargo of wheat for the United Kingdom.

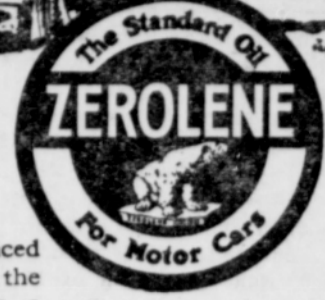
