**A REPUBLICAN YEAR**

"Malne goes republican." That settles it. This is a republican year. The Los Angeles Times says there are more than a million and a quarter registered voters in California and 780,000 of them are proud to officially record themselves as republicans, while but 282,500 are registered as democrats. Those who do not give their party designation number 143,000. If most of these should turn out to be democrats the republicans would still have them snowed under by a vote of more than two to one. It is hard to imagine the Cox shouters finding a place to hang up their hats.

The latest record from the office of the Secretary of State shows there are 314,292 voters registered in Oregon, with 209,096 republicans, 85,405 democrats and 19,292 miscellaneous.

The registration books in the various Oregon counties are open again, and no doubt the registrations up to about the first of October will run in substantially the same proportions, as to number of republicans, democrats and miscellaneous.

If all the miscellaneous voters in Oregon should in November mark their ballots for the democratic candidates, and all the democrats should vote straight, and the republicans should vote as they have registered, all the candidates on the republican tickets for state and national offices would be elected, over two to one.

In this year, of all years, this ought to be the result, for the welfare of the people of this country, the good of the world, and for the best interests of all the people of Oregon.

Warren G. Harding, the next president, should have a republican senate and a republican house with him.

Robert N. Stanfield is the republican candidate for United States senator from Oregon. He is a man of good address, marked ability, a man of affairs, a successful business man, whose services would be of value to his state and his country.

If other states are doubtful, make Oregon more sure.

Warren G. Harding is a "sound man, tried in the fire of public service, unwarped and unafraid."

Harding's front porch campaign should be strongly backed up by a front window campaign on the part of all who desire his election.
