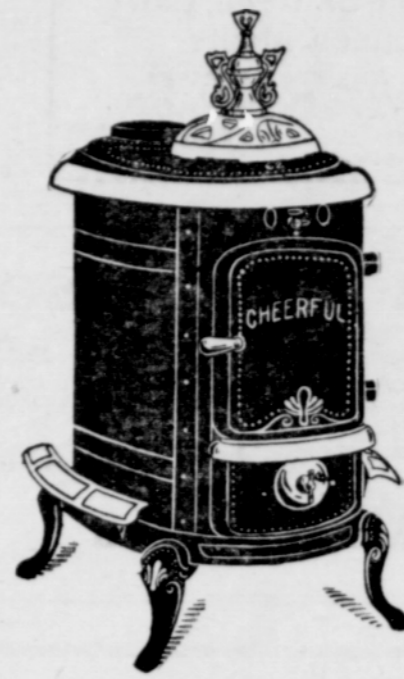

## RAKER & SON TO HAVE NEW GARAGE

Work was commenced Monday on the new \$22,000 cement and tile garage which will be erected by C. I. Raker & Son to handle their increasing business.

The new building will be of the most modern construction and will be about 125 foot square. This building will face Powell street with a frontage of 110 feet.

Besides this large building, another two story building 50 x 50 feet will be erected facing south Main street. This building will be modern and fireproof. The basement will be used for the storage of oils, etc. Owing to the lay of the ground it will be possible to drive from south Main street into the basement. The upper story will be a work shop equipped with all of the latest machinery and labor saving devices.

It is expected that the garage will be ready for use January 1st. C. E. Cree, a well-known contractor, is in charge of the work.
