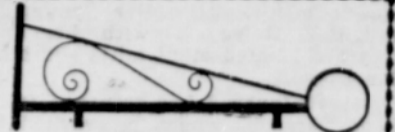
Mrs. Frank Moore returned Wednesday from Idaho Falls where she had been for the past month visiting her son and family.
