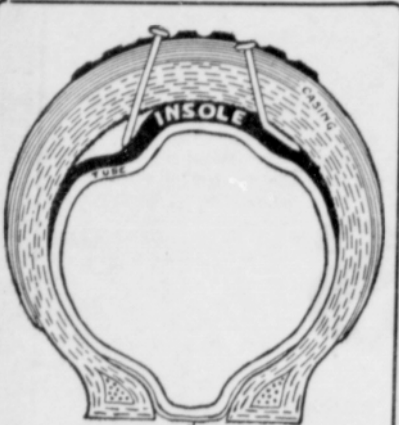

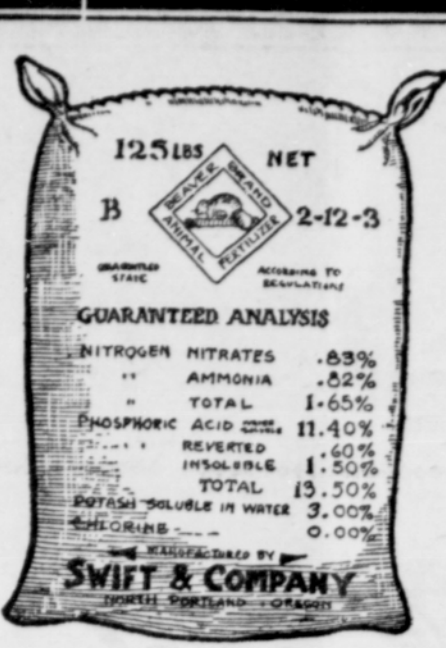

Ford Opposes the National Tractor Association.

The National Tractor association recently made a ruling that no practical test or demonstration of Power Farming should take place during the Oregon state fair. Contrary to this ruling the Ford Motor company is staging the greatest demonstration of Power Farming ever given in the Northwest.
