McARTHUR AND THE 18TH AMENDMENT.

Many republicans who admire the constructive legislation and the statesmanship of Congressman C. N. McArthur but who deprecate his consistent and persistent voting with the wet element have felt that they were in a quandary in the present situation, when a quiet but strong campaign is on by wet advocates to defeat every congressman who voted for the submission of the prohibition amendment or for the Volstead act and to elect those who would vote to weaken the enabling act.

Those who know him best believe that above everything else he is a man of his word, as his past acts would indicate. What he would do in the future is clearly set forth in letters to the public press over his signature, in which he says: "The national prohibition amendment is now a part of the constitution of the United States and the Volstead act is a part of the law of the land and as such should be rigidly enforced. I have already voted against the repeal of the Volstead act (see Congressional Record, March 4, 1920, page 4154) and I shall continue to oppose any and all attempts to weaken or emasculate either the law or the constitutional amendment until the people of the third Oregon district, speaking through the medium of the ballot, shall direct me otherwise.
