Representative R. B. Lee, of Multnomah county, has introduced a bill amending the present tax law providing that the second half of the year's taxes will not become delinquent until December 5, instead of October 5 as at present; also that the penalty for failure to pay taxes be reduced from 5 per cent, as at present, to 2 per cent. No change is proposed in the date for payment of the first half of taxes on April 5.

The attempt to unseat Herbert H. Gordon, elected representative from Multnomah county, did not succeed. It was claimed by an opposer that he was not legally elected because he had run for two offices at the same election, namely, mayor of Portland and state representative. He was defeated for mayor but elected to the legislature by a large vote.
