Germans. They also saw some remains of the barbed wire entanglements. Crews of men are rapidly leveling these fields preparing them for cultivation.

One of the interesting places that were visited by the Van Donincks was the grotto of Han, an immense underground cavern and labyrinths bored by "La Lesse" a river which winds under the mountain. This is one of the most wonderful scenic trips of the world and takes more than two hours during which time one passes from one wonderful formation to another underground.

Mrs. Van Doninck says that the people of this country can not realize what the war has meant to people in Europe. Even now after these years one has to have a pass to go from one town to another and she isn't just sure what would happen if one didn't have a pass for they were careful to keep theirs on hand.

She also marvels at the way the natives can find their way about in Antwerp for the streets are so winding and end so abruptly that it is impossible for an inexperienced person to find their way about. There are no cities in America that can compare with Antwerp for crooked streets according to Mrs. Van Doninck.

She found that there was a good deal of English spoken there and a great deal of French. During her four months' stay she was able to pick up enough of the Flemish language to enable her to get along very nicely. Mr. Van Doninck expressed a good deal of surprise at the amount of English spoken by the Belgians and especially among the children.

Altogether their trip was a delightful one full of interest and they were glad to find the people of Belgium recovering so rapidly from the effects of the war.

LOGANBERRY PACK TO BE INCREASED IN 1921

More than 7,000,000 pounds of loganberries will be packed by Washington and Oregon plants during the present year, according to W. G. Allen, manager of Hunt Brothers' Packing company, who gave an address at the weekly luncheon of the Salem Commercial club held at Salem recently.

Of the loganberry pack last year there is only 30 per cent of the stock on hand in the two states, and of the entire fruit crop there is only 27 per cent of the stock unsold at the present time, according to Mr. Allen.
