HIGH SCHOOL OR CHAUTAQUA?

The Chautauqua idea was a grand conception and its lectures and entertainments have brought a great inspiration and uplift to many a community. It has been welcomed in Gresham for a few years past, except the two war years, and has helped to emphasize the educational tone and tendencies of the locality. It has been evident every year it has been held that people are interested, are glad to get back of it and want the benefits.

Every year there has been a deficit for the guarantors to meet. Last year, on account mainly of the conflict with the high school commencement week, the deficit was the largest of any. The guarantors felt assured that the dates would be so arranged by the Chautauqua people this year that there would not be a conflict. But this was not done, although the Ellison-White System is said to have been given ample notice by the guarantors. Hence the situation is regarded as rather expediting and very unsatisfactory to those who would like a summer Chautauqua here.

The main excuse for the holding of the Chautauqua is its educational value. A strong point has always been to get the children and young people to attend. Much help financially is expected from sale of tickets to high school pupils. These benefits would be largely cut off by the proposed dates for this year. It is not alone the one night of commencement. The whole week, so far as pupils and their parents and friends are concerned, is necessarily filled full of important events.

Hence, when the situation is simmered down, it seems to resolve itself into this—which is the more important, the Chautauqua or the high school commencement? If they must conflict, thus cutting off much of the anticipated benefit of the Chautauqua, which may the people reasonably be expected to support? There can be little question the Chautauqua will suffer.

Every effort has been made to adjust the matter of dates without success. The Chautauqua depends upon the public for its success. It looks like rather poor business for an organization to bind certain well meaning individuals on an absolute guarantee to prepare the way for a Chautauqua and bear the financial deficit, if any in connection therewith, and then so arrange the seasons that in spite of every reasonable effort public opinion is turned against the plans and only failure

and loss to the guarantors can result. There must be a better way; if not, the outlook is not encouraging.

HOUSE CLEANING TIME.
