A COMMUNITY LOSS.

After six years of successful educational work as principal of the union high school Elmer F. Goodwin has resigned to accept an offer from a newly organized union high school district in Union county, eastern Oregon. Although Mr. Goodwin was under contract for another year, and was ready to continue his work here if the board refused to release him, the granting of his request is a tribute to the man and a recognition of his high ability as an organizer and educator rather than otherwise. The high school here has been put far ahead, so that it stands in the front rank of the state's high schools, by Mr. Goodwin's influence and leadership. Now that he has an opportunity to do the same or better in another and larger field, under even more encouraging conditions, is a ground for favorable action by the high school board and for congratulation on the part of Mr. Goodwin's wide circle of friends.

Mr. Goodwin's influence in this locality has been most wholesome in every way. His quiet but thorough discipline, his high moral ideals, his unflinching devotion, his true Americanism, have ever inspired his students towards high attainments in character and ability. Not only in his relation to students is his ability manifest. His relations with teachers and directors have been such as to insure the largest success of the school in charge. It should also be recognized that Mrs. Goodwin has been an aid to her husband in his educational work and a strong force in the social and religious activities of the community. The friendships they have formed and influences for good they have started will not terminate when they move to a new field.
