

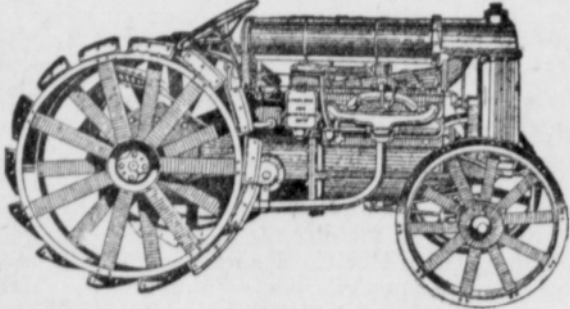

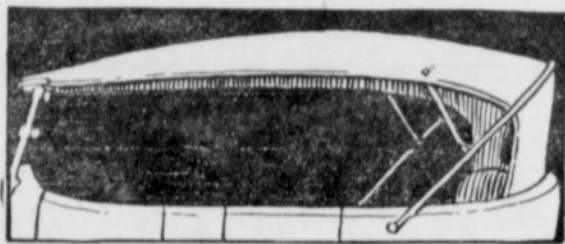

### JAPANESE BOY DIES DURING OPERATION

Shigeki Takao, 11-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. H. Takao who lives on the Coons place on the Base Line road, died at a Portland hospital Wednesday, April 13, during an operation.

Shigeki broke his leg on March 24, 1920 and since that time has been unable to attend school. The first time the bone was broken it did not knit properly and the bone had to be rebroken.

It was only about two weeks ago that he was allowed to return to school. Last Friday while he was walking around the school grounds the injured leg suddenly gave way under him and it was necessary to remove him to the hospital.

He was not strong enough to survive the operation and died before coming out from under the ether.

Funeral services were conducted at the Methodist church in Gresham Thursday afternoon by the Japanese Buddhist priest Tabiguchi from Portland, assisted by Rev. A. S. Hisey, of Gresham.

The concluding services were held at the Mt. Scott crematorium.

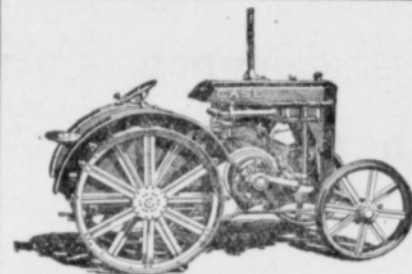
