FOREST PROTECTION AND THE SNELL BILL.

For the first time in American history the need of a comprehensive national policy of forest protection, distributing the necessary effort equitably between government states, the public and lumbermen, has become so admittedly urgent that representative majorities of all these agencies have agreed upon and recommended to congress specific legislation under which they can cooperate. The Snell bill, one of the first introduced in this session of congress, provides not only for extension of federal activity on lands in government ownership but also for federal aid in the development of fire prevention and reforestation by states and the industry in the forested regions. It has the endorsement of the U. S. Forest Service and of substantially all state forest departments, consumers' and forestry associations, and organizations of lumbermen and timber owners. Its consideration is being delayed by the pressure of other important matters before congress, but public interest in this subject also is supposed to be one of the objects of President Harding's recent proclamation covering the setting aside of Forest Protection Week, May 22-28.

H. G. HARMON LAID TO REST AT MT. SCOTT

The funeral of H. G. Harmon, who passed away at his home near Gresham last Monday after a brief illness, was held on Thursday afternoon at the Baptist church in Gresham. The Rev. Jesse Brown officiating. The members of M. A. Ross Post G. A. R., of which he was a member, and the Women's Relief Corps attended in a body. The interment was in Mount Scott cemetery.

In February, 1890, Mr. Harmon married Miss Emma Partridge, and in 1906 the family came to Oregon.

Mr. Harmon is survived by one son Clifford of Portland and an adopted son, Glen, of Boring, besides his widow, A. D. Harmon of Portland is a brother and Mrs. Mollie Meyers of Coffie, Missouri, is a sister.
