"HIDDEN" ISLAND.

The proposed Gresham-Portland fair site, located between Portland and Gresham, is becoming more inviting every day—the sun shines while some of the other proposed sites are growing more and more dubious. Water—too much water—is a great dampener. Some one refers to Hayden Island as "Hidden Island." That's about what it looks like now, nearly all covered with the flood waters of the Columbia.

It is proposed to invite the 1925 fair directors and a few others interested to a luncheon, may be on some beautiful and slightly spot on the proposed site, and show them.

If this is brought about they will be shown that in this vicinity is not only one site but choice of several, any of which is inviting, easily accessible by highway, rail and street car, needing practically no preparation and obtainable at lowest initial cost.

NEW MOTOR CODE.

Some of the new provisions of Oregon's new motor code which went into effect Wednesday are as follows:

No vehicle shall be parked upon the main traveled portion of the highways of the state, except when such vehicle is so disabled as to prohibit its moving of same.

Laws governing driving of trucks provide that they observe all the rules of touring cars, also that a mirror be provided, so placed as to permit the driver to have a clear and unobstructed view to the rear of approaching vehicles desiring to pass.

When bringing an automobile to a stop under the new law, motorists are required to extend one hand and wave it up and down instead of allowing it to hang limply beside the car as at present. Motorists are also required to slow down to twelve miles an hour when passing school houses and at road crossings and to fifteen miles an hour when crossing railroads. Pedestrians when using the public highway shall at all times walk upon the left side of such highway and facing the traffic.

Every bicycle operated upon the streets or highways of the state shall be equipped with a front light and a red rear light or red reflex mirror.

HOMESEEEKERS TO LOCATE IN OREGON

July 19 will mark the date when the first trainload of homeseekers from the middle west will start from Omaha to Oregon, according to announcement made by the executive committee of the Oregon state chamber of commerce following receipt of a long telegram from William Hanley from Omaha. This date was selected by the heads of the agricultural department of the Union Pacific system at Omaha and confirmed here by the executive committee of the state chamber.

Hanley, as a director of the state chamber, is in Omaha with J. R. Heuring, colonization expert who is working with Union Pacific officials in grouping together homeseekers to be brought to Oregon in a body. The agricultural department of the Union Pacific will swing its whole forces into the drive to send settlers to Oregon, it was announced.

Following notification as to the results of the conference in Omaha, Secretary Quayle of the state chamber sent out letters to each commercial organization of the state, urging them to prepare for the coming of the settlers, first, by obtaining listings of lands in their districts at prices based upon careful appraisal, and second, to form, if possible, a corporation of financing commission composed of the leading business men of the community, for the purpose of buying up these available lands, or obtaining options upon them, under terms that will permit the settler to make good.

"In regard to preparing for the reception of the settlers when they arrive in Oregon," said Secretary Quayle, "Eugene business men have already perfected a tentative organization, the purpose of which is to buy or obtain options on lands available for the settler, and re-sell these lands on easy terms and long time payments. The Crook county chamber of commerce was recently formed and is already at work preparing for the homeseekers. The Baker county chamber of commerce has a committee working on plans for taking care of settlers when they arrive in Baker.

"These communities are to be commended for the promptness with which they are meeting the situation, and I am certain that all other communities will do their share. The state chamber can only bring the settlers to Oregon. It is up to the individual districts to take care of them when they arrive and see that they are located where they can make good."

Many applications for admission to the special homeseekers' party are already on file from middle western farmers according to Secretary Quayle. A recent letter from Gary, Indiana, stated that three representative citizens of a large colony of prospective settlers had been selected to join the party.
