The Red Peril

Property worth \$250,000,000 goes up in smoke every year, rankin H. Wentworth of Boston asserted in a recent address in San Francisco.

He urged cooperation by local organizations of citizens to eliminate fire hazards which were enormously reducing the national wealth.

Wentworth, who is secretary of the National Fire Protection Association said that in the first four months of this year there had been a loss of \$12,000,000, but that before the end of 1921 there would be consigned to the ash heap property valued at a quarter of a billion dollars. He said there are optimists in America who state that we are reducing the fire waste because this average figure of \$250,000,000 now represents inflated values. There is little comfort for us in that academic reflection. The present housing situation it too desperate for us to be so complacent over it.

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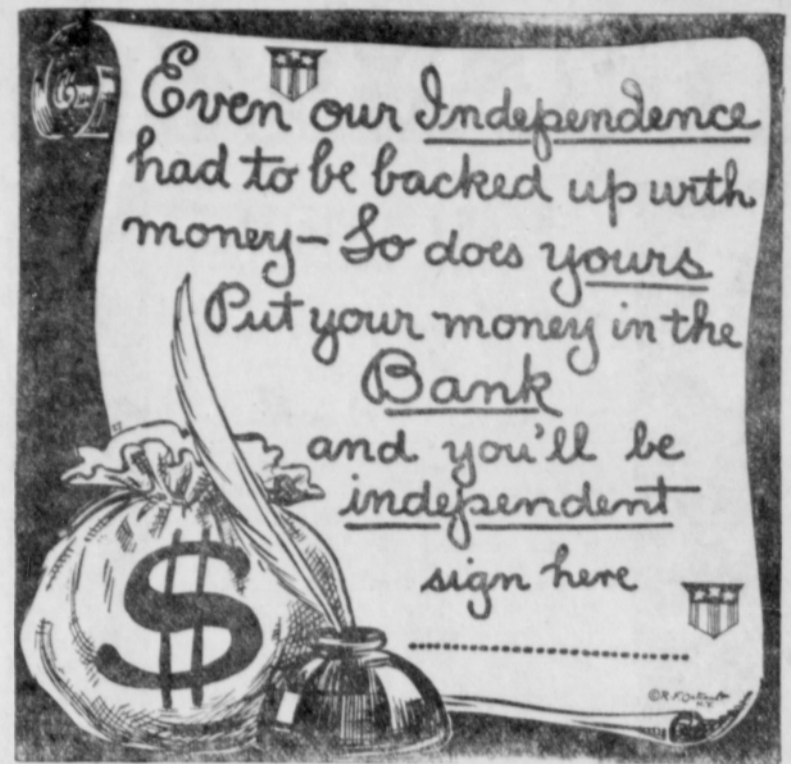
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SANDY BLUFF
