HELP PREVENT FOREST FIRES

Over \$640,000,000 in merchantable timber is annually endangered by fire in Oregon. Timber, next to land itself, is the state's greatest resource. The lumber industry today employs ten times as many men as any other manufacturing industry in the state.

From May until October each year the fire danger is ever present. Thirteen percent of the fires are caused by lightning while 87 percent are caused by human agencies. The 87 percent of the man-caused fires can be eliminated if every person will be more careful with fire.

The greatest menace to the forests is fire, which destroys the timber, dries up the streams, drives away wild life, and leaves in its wake, ruin and desolation.

All National Forest headquarters and Ranger Stations have telephones. If you discover a forest fire call central and ask to be connected with the nearest Forest Officer.

All campers should be familiar with section 9 of the Oregon Camp Fire Law which says:

"Any person who builds a camp fire upon lands within the state, not his own, without clearing the ground immediately around it free from material which will carry fire, or who leaves thereon a camp fire burning and unattended, (fire does not have to do damage) or who permits a camp fire to spread thereon, or who uses in any fire arms discharged thereon other than incandescent gunwadding, shall be punished by a fine of not less than five (\$5.00) dollars nor more than one hundred (\$100.00) dollars, or by imprisonment of not less than two (2) days nor more than fifty (50) days."
