SETTLERS' EXCURSION POSTPONED TILL FALL
The excursion of homeseekers from the middle western states which was scheduled to start today from Omaha, Nebraska, has been postponed until September 20. This word was received recently by the State Chamber of Commerce and active preparations are being made for the September trip.

The July excursion was postponed upon request of a large number of homeseekers who were unable to make the trip until after harvest.

Commercial clubs of the state have been urged to complete the listing of available lands in each community for the information of

the settlers, and these listed lands will be placed in the hands of each member of the party, according to Secretary Quayle.

George Quayle, general secretary of the State Chamber, left today on a tour of the state for the purpose of securing representatives of various districts who will assist the state chamber representative in the middle west in the work of lining up prospective settlers.

A long telegram from Omaha, requesting additional literature on Oregon for distribution among prospective settlers, stated that a large number of homeseekers are preparing to come to Oregon in September after harvest is over.

FORD'S NEW VENTURE.
If Henry Ford could succeed as well in manufacturing nitrates as he has making flivvers his newest proposed venture might be a blessing to the country. Henry proposes to take the Muscle Shoals nitrate plant off the government's hands provided the government spends, it is said, about twenty-eight millions more on changes and improvements in the plant. It was built as a war emergency and never produced a thing of value. It represents one of those colossal blunders of the democratic war policy. Will the government be throwing away more good money if it prepares the plant for Ford's use? Ford proposes to manufacture fertilizer.

Sermons to Aid Disarmament.
General Tasker H. Bliss says that the clergymen of the U. S. can bring about limitation of armaments by simultaneously preaching a sermon upon the subject throughout the country in every church of every creed, and concluding their services by having their congregations adopt resolutions to this effect to be sent to their respective representatives in congress, will be the subject of resolutions to be taken up at the Sunday afternoon services of the churches of Portland in Laurelhurst and Peninsula parks. The disarmament services will be held and the resolutions forwarded to Washington immediately.

"If the churches cannot agree upon that, it will not be done, nor will it be done until the good God puts into them the proper spirit of religion. The responsibility is entirely upon the professing Christians of the United States. If another war like the last one should come they will be responsible for every drop of blood that will be shed and for every dollar wastefully expended," concluded General Bliss in his statement.
