THE EXPOSITION OF 1925.

Portland and Oregon met last Wednesday evening to properly celebrate the signing of the joint resolution passed by congress giving President Harding authority to invite foreign nations to participate in the Atlantic-Pacific Highways-Electrical Exposition in Portland in 1925.

The crowds that filled the street, in spite of the threatening weather, were enthusiastic and the various localities competing for the site were loud in their claims. Above all was the feeling that the coming of this exposition would be of untold value in bringing to the attention of the world the vast undeveloped resources of the state. Nor will Portland and Oregon alone profit by this exposition, but the whole Pacific Northwest will feel the impetus which will result.

Oregon has been first in showing her loyalty and support of the government on former occasions and her citizens are now imbued with the thought that by giving cooperation in this great project a real service will be given to the state.

Governor Olcott, in his recent message to the people of Oregon, said that this would be an opportunity to present the resources, scenic advantages and the civilization west of the Rockies to all the world.

"Oregon has occasion to rejoice to its fullest" said Governor Olcott, "for the opportunity to stage the first great peace-loving and industrial exposition since the close of the war, wherein the nations of the world will be our guests."

homes and fine crops. In our opinion it has no equal in the state. From here we turned toward Salem, a distance of 26 miles over the roughest road of our journey. The country for the most part was rather uninviting, the land thin, gray and sterile and bore poor crops. The noon hour had come and passed before we made the capitol city. So after bumping, bumping over the ugly road for miles, our gastric machinery seemed to be giving way and demanded our immediate attention. We pulled up and parked the machine under some stately spreading oaks in front of a farm home. After permission from the owner we eagerly dispatched with a fine luncheon which ended up with home-made cookies and apple pie. We slaked our thirst from a hydrant of spring water across the road at the old dairy house, piped from high up on a picturesque timbered slope far back on the farm. Feeling much better now we soon reached the Willamette and crossed on the fine new bridge constructed of concrete and iron that arched the stream, here into Salem, the prettiest city in Oregon. The extremely wide and well shaded streets and avenues lined with old palatial homes, its modern business blocks is a perfect delight to everyone who visits the capitol city.

We spent some time looking through both the assembly halls of the capitol building. The most interesting things of all were the life-sized portraits which graced the walls, of strong-faced men who have made history and moulded the destinies of our wonderful commonwealth. From here we drove down the broad avenue leading to the state prison. There it was right at the end of the street which is suggestive of the end of things to so many of the inmates so far as this life is concerned. The buildings enclosed with high walls loomed up gray and grim and portentous. All was quiet, no movement save a load of jute fiber that passed through the clanging gate of the wall on the lone

guard who stood on the wall near a tower with gun in hand eagerly scanning the movement of every moving thing.

We cared not to enter this sad abode of the living dead—buried behind these frowning, dismal, gray walls. In low accent we talked of the pity of it all, who have made such derelicts of their lives and wondered why men continue to take the wrong road in life. I thought of the Bible passage: "There is a way which seemeth right unto a man but the end thereof are the ways of death."

From the prison we went on to the state hospital for the insane. A wonderful building is this, surrounded with large park-like grounds in which great groups of inmates lounged or sat.

The state fair grounds were next visited. Activity on every hand was noticeable getting ready for the big fair. Two new commodious fire-proof buildings are being finished. Our trip on home was through French Prairie, a good country, and down about Woodburn we must have been getting hungry again for we thought the roasting ears and potatoes and other tempting stuff looked greener and more succulent than at any other point. At Oregon City, the Manchester of Ore, we lightly lunched again. After which we concluded our happy journey of 150 miles at 7 p. m. The Willamette valley is a land of charm, filled with ideal homes and fields, peace and plenty, music and poetry.

Truly it flows with milk and honey.

after knowing from personal experience what America and the American flag mean here, I am devoted more deeply than ever before to this great humanitarian cause. Our steady hand as well as our contributions for the sustenance and rehabilitation of these innocent sufferers are needed now as never before. I want to say, too, that the Armenian orphans I have seen at Constantinople, at Ismid and at Derindje are fine specimens of boyhood and girlhood and give every promise of great leadership among their races.

When the 225 boys at Derindje gathered today on the pier as our ship was leaving and sang with great gusto and feeling our good old "Star Spangled Banner" it brought tears to my eyes. I want the folks back home to know that it is a good work we are doing—a worth while work.
