UNEMPLOYMENT.

The country has become used to campaigns of various sorts. It looks now as if the next great campaign, in this country, a campaign for this fall and winter, will be one to provide for the army of unemployed. The best way to do this is to provide employment. It will take some investment and considerable planning but it is a national necessity which everyone with property or capital should try to meet.

Secretary of Labor Davis recently stated that there were 5,735,000 out of work in this country. President Harding has called a national conference on unemployment and Secretary of Commerce Hoover has already formulated plans for the conference. In a statement he says that the object of the conference will be to inquire into the volume of needed employment, the distribution of unemployment, to make recommendations as to measures that can properly be taken in speeding up employment by industries and public bodies during the coming winter and also a broad study of economic measures intended to relieve the situation and give added impulse to business and commerce.

Opinions differ greatly as to the benefit which may result from the conference, as to the causes of the present condition of unemployment and the remedies.

Great good will result if those who can in any way provide work will make it a matter of individual conscience to do so, for the sake of reasonable gain if possible, but in any case that the worker may have a chance to earn the necessities of life.

INCOME TAX STATISTICS FOR OREGON GIVEN

Federal personal income tax returns filed in Oregon in 1919 reach a total of 49,663, which was .93 per cent of the entire number filed in the United States. The total net income reported by these returns was \$166,240,606, while the tax paid on them was \$8,232,437, which was .65 per cent of the total personal income tax paid in the entire country.

In the nation at large 5.03 per cent of the people filed personal income tax returns, while in Oregon, 6.34 per cent filed them.

The average net income per return for the United States was \$3,724.05, and in Oregon it was \$3,347.37. The personal income tax per capita for the United States amounted to \$11.98, and in Oregon it was \$10.51. The average amount of the personal income tax per return in the United States was \$238.08, and in Oregon it was \$165.77.

Oregon's position in the order of magnitude as to all the states and territories in the Union, in the per cent of population filing returns was 17th, and 29th in the average net income per return. Its position as to per capita income tax was 13th and 20th in the average amount of tax per return.

The number of personal income tax returns filed for the years 1916, 1917, 1918, and 1919 in Oregon, as well as the amounts of net income and tax are shown in the following table:

In both Oregon and Washington committees appointed by the governors of these states are working on the problem of more equitable distribution of the tax burden.

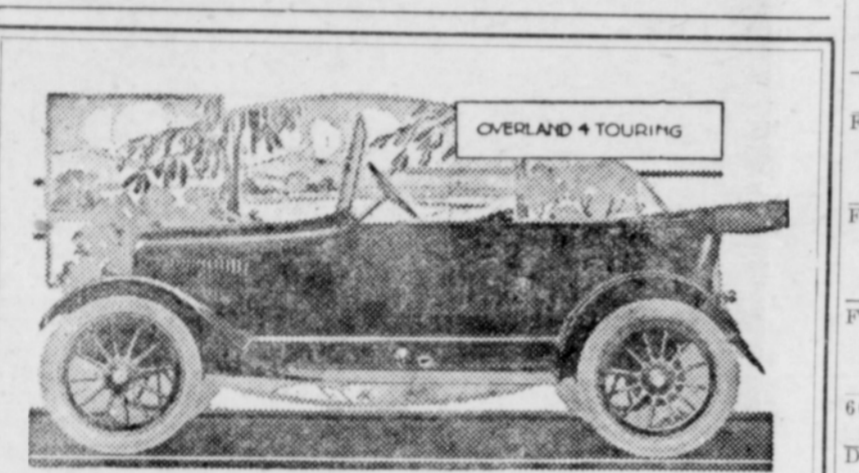
