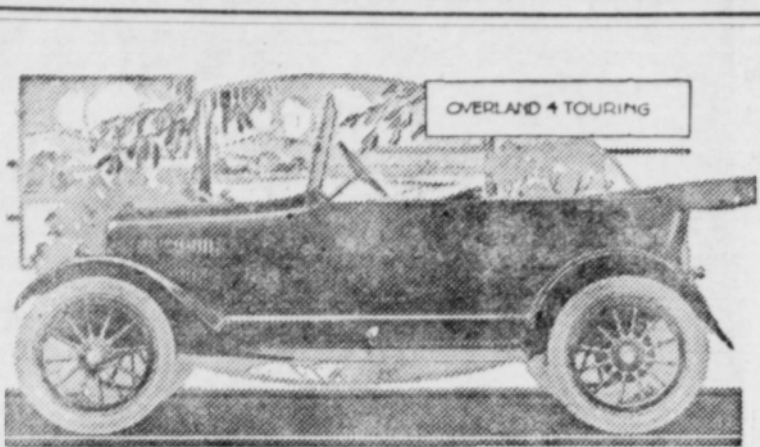
The leaders of the Seventh Day Adventist church have temporarily abandoned all services at this place, and have welcomed the people of the community to use their building.
