S. B. Hall, county agent, gave a short talk on the kinds of berries to grow and advised making the Cutbert raspberry the main crop but advised planting a sufficient acreage of other fruits to spread the season, both as to the operation of the cannery and as to labor upon the farm.

Many other questions were asked Mr. Hall regarding fertilization, cultivation, pruning, etc., which he did not take time to answer as the hour was growing late but he invited personal conferences and asked that the berry growers of the county inform him at once as to the subjects they would desire taken up at the Farmers Institute in January. The institute will commence January 16 and continue all week. One entire day will be devoted to berry culture.

With a chart Mr. Hall demonstrated the value of properly cared for fruits. According to this year's output at the cannery the berries that were solid, medium in size and in good shape went into "fancy" pack and at prices this year averaged 12.27 cents per pound. Of the 5603 cases packed only 12 per cent re-

main unsold. Of the next grade "choice" pack 1898 cases were packed of which 27 per cent remain unsold and the average price per pound was 10.86 cents.

Of the standard pack, 961 cases were packed at an average return to the grower of 9.66 cents but only 3 per cent of this has been sold at this time, leaving on hand 97 per cent of this kind of stock. This shows that the highest price goods move the most rapidly and brings very much greater returns to the grower. The fancy pack brought more than 2 1/2 cents greater return to the growers for each pound of berries than did the standard.

The board of directors met and organized with H. G. Andrews president, W. O. Lindeman vice president of both the Berry Growers Packing company and the Co-operative Berry Growers association. Miss Cora B. Green is secretary of the Packing company, and D. E. Towle is treasurer. Of the co-operative association K. A. Miller is the secretary-treasurer for the coming year.
