BLANKS FOR INCOME TAX RETURNS READY

Blank forms for filing individual returns of income for the year 1921 of \$5000 and less are now available at the office of Clyde G. Huntley.

Income tax returns for the year 1921 must be made not later than March 15, 1922, or the delinquent taxpayer will be liable to heavy penalties provided in the new Revenue Law for failure to file a return and pay the tax on time.

Blanks are now being mailed to all taxpayers who last year filed a return, so it will not be necessary for those who made returns last year to write for the necessary blanks with which to make their 1921 returns.

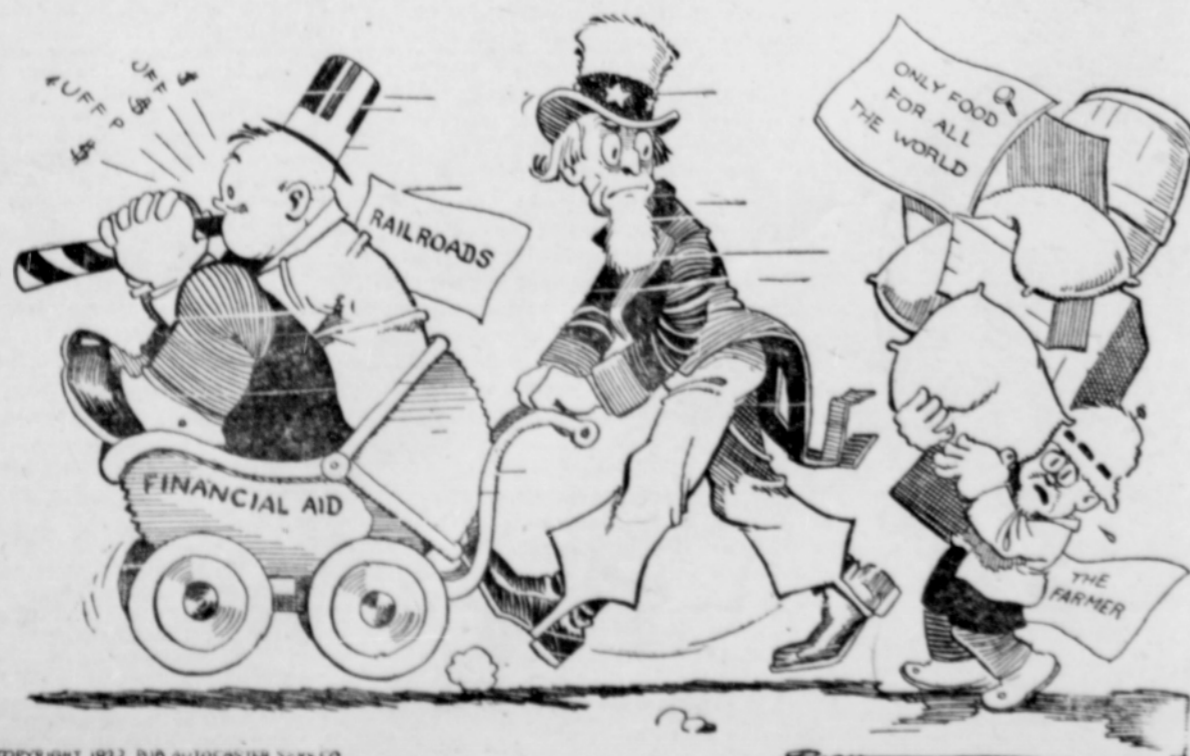
