BERRY ASSOCIATION FIELD NOTES

Manager Berry Growers' Packing Co. Have you applied the fertilizer to the berries? It is high time. What plan do you follow of applying the barnyard fertilizer? Do you allow it to lie in the yard and leach out the best of the fertility during the winter rainy season and then spend as much time and labor to haul what is left or do you haul and spread some from time to time and allow it to leach into the soil where it will give you a hundred per cent benefit. Please ponder.

Our commercial fertilizers are coming in slowly—many having failed to order. Why not do it now? You do not need the cash. Your credit is good and you can buy at the cash price plus 7 per cent. We can carry a \$100 fertilizer account for six months for \$3.50, and the use of \$100 worth should bring you \$207 in six months.

We are sold out on canned goods now and are working on the delivery of the last sale of 700 cases of standard Cuthberts. We are paying up to 9c per pound now. Have you received your money? If not, come in and check up.

We will close our 1922 pool soon. Have you any berry growing friends who should join our association? If so, please whisper to them to come in and contract for this the fourth year of our cooperative effort.
