SMELT ARE RUNNING IN SANDY RIVER

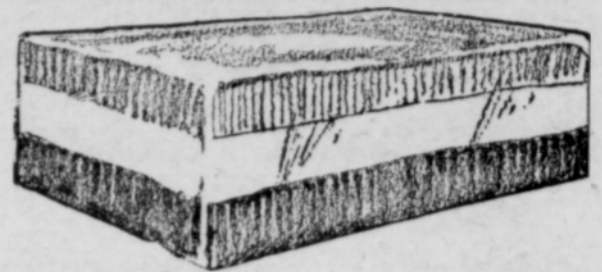

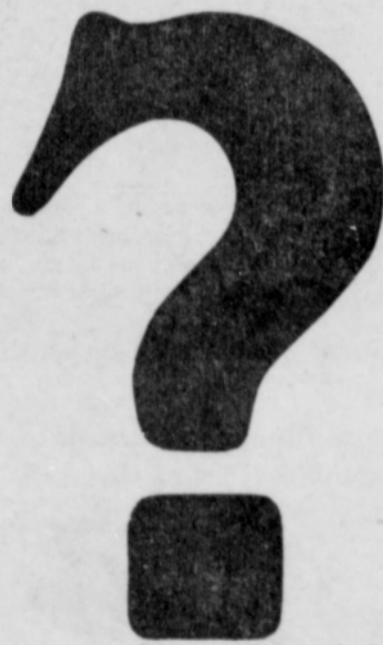
