GIRLS WILL "DOLL UP."

Efficiency experts of the Treasury department have figured that it costs the country \$6,000,000 in wasted time to permit the government stenographers to "doll up," and girls will "doll up" in spite of the government. The loss of time is estimated at 15,000,000 hours. A year or so ago an enterprising New York newspaper publisher with more knowledge of statistics than of the profession he sought to dominate figured out that he lost several hundred dollars a week because his reporters and copyreaders smoked, losing time striking matches, "rolling their own" and in the manipulation of their pipes. Probes of this kind open up limitless possibilities. For example, it would be interesting to learn the cost to the country of the time wasted in the clubs and business sanctums, doping out the best possible way to "get an edge" on the farmers—time not merely eliminated from the scheme of things but actually used to destroy the reward of production. What was the value of the time wasted in government investigation to prove the packers had exploited the public, plus the time wasted by Attorney General Palmer in broadcasting to the world the terrible things he was going to do to the meat trust crowd? Passing to another line of thought how many human lives does it cost every year because the government spends its time and the people's money trying to conserve the life of hogs and ignores the necessity of spreading useful information that would conserve the lives and the health of women and children? Life has a cash value. Surely it might be considered even from an economic standpoint. Keep on doling up girls! Your sweet American faces bring to us a sense of pleasure and give us relief from a steady pondering over the more serious things of life. It might be dangerous if the efficiency experts went too far.

O. A. EASTMAN A CANDIDATE

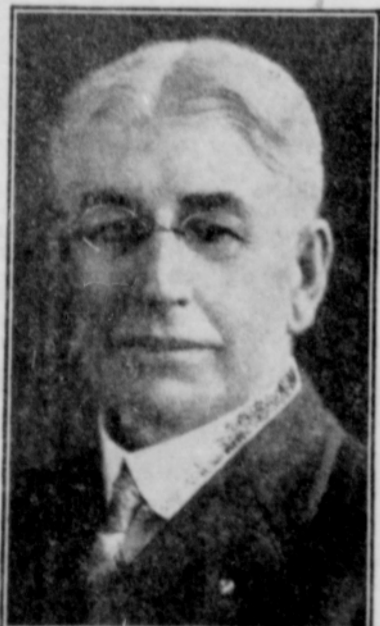
O. A. Eastman has filed his petition for nomination for representative as a result of the urging of substantial citizens and taxpayers of eastern Multnomah county.

It has been 16 or 18 years since Multnomah county outside of Portland had a representative at Salem, the last one being B. C. Altman. Some years ago Chas. Cleveland was nominated but failed to get the election.

Candidates will not be as plentiful this time evidently, as formerly, unless many have held off their petitions as the time for filing is about up.

In any case the voters should get squarely behind Mr. Eastman and put him over. It is due to the large interests which center in the agricultural part of Multnomah county that a man be elected from this section. But he will also be a representative of the whole county.

SWEET CHERRIES NEED CROSS-POLLINATION

Oregon's leading cherries which are the Napoleon or Royal Ann, Bing and Lambert, are not only self-sterile but inter-sterile as well. This startling fact was brought out and announced by the state college experiment station away back in 1911, 1912 and 1913. Based on these findings, recommendations were made to topwork about 11 per cent of all sweet cherries in commercial orchards with pollenizers. Black Tartarian and Black Republican were recommended as pollenizers for the dark species such as Bing and Lambert. The Waterhouse is to be planted for the light colored such as Royal Ann and Napoleon.

How many growers acted on the recommendations is not known, but that at least five per cent of them did is certain. The net gain annually from even this small percentage of full bearing trees is about \$72,000. Had all growers followed the plan, it is estimated the annual value of the cherry crop in Oregon would be five times what it is now, making the value, \$1,800,000 instead of \$36,000 as at present. Growers who have reported on the plan had better results than the estimated 500 per cent increase in production.—O. A. C. Experiment Station.

Legion Opposes Monument.

Fourteen states already have refused financial assistance to the move for a George Washington and World War Memorial building in Washington, D. C., and 16 other states will follow suit, according to the American Legion's committee. The legion opposes construction of the elaborate memorial at a time when thousands of ex-service men are jobless and in need.

The American Legion of Ludlow, Vermont, has made official report of the prowess of John Sheehan, overseas doughboy, who strangled to death a wild-cat with his bare hands. Sheehan, wounded four times by the bob-cat, was rewarded with an \$8.00 state bounty. The soldier and the beast came to blows in a remote mountain pass.
