**CANDIDATES RECOMMENDED.**

Among the 37 republican candidates who have filed for representative from the 18th district, Multnomah county, is O. A. Eastman of Gresham. He gives as his platform: "Support the constitution of the state of Oregon and the constitution of the United States to the best of my ability." His slogan is: "Laws supporting true Americanism, state and county progress at lowest tax possible."

All of the other candidates are Portland men. The Outlook especially recommends Mr. Eastman to the voters of the county and particularly of this locality. The eastern portion of Multnomah county is entitled to a representative at Salem. There are many in Portland who seek for the honor and most of them probably from patriotic motives. But it is difficult to find any substantial citizen or business man in this part of the county who is willing to undergo the expense and inconvenience of "running" for office. It had to be urged upon Mr. Eastman. He is the victim. Now let's rally to his support and nominate him.

Among other candidates for the legislature you will find Herman A. Lewis, who, though a resident of Portland, is the nearest to the agricultural interests of the county of all other candidates. In fact, he belongs almost as much to eastern Multnomah as to Portland. As a prominent granger and president of the Multnomah county fair he understands the local conditions and needs better than the average lawyer or business man of the metropolis.

Voters can be assured that every word in Mr. Lewis' platform is sincere and his acquaintance and loyalty should commend him to the men and women who will vote on May 19th.

His platform is as follows: "Represent the people of my district honestly, conscientiously, and to the best of my ability. Will work for compulsory education in our free public schools and will do all in my power to encourage, foster and promote the agricultural and industrial development of the state, and particularly for the benefit of the white race."

**WHITE'S PLATFORM.**

George A. White, adjutant-general for Oregon, has not been mixed up in politics in the past and comes to his candidacy for nomination for governor of Oregon with clean hands. He has, however, for years been in public life and has held peculiarly responsible positions which have proven his natural ability and developed a comprehension of large business and executive affairs.

He is not an "office seeker" but desires to serve his state for the state's good. If he did not believe in himself and his ability to do for Oregon as its chief executive, what is most needed at this time, he would not be a candidate. And if his friends did not believe in the man and that he will do what he and they comprehend to be the needed and right things to be done they would not back him so generally and so enthusiastically.

Here is his platform. Read it, digest it, and compare it with others:

1. Immediate deflation of state expenditures by cutting at least one million dollars from the present cost at the next session of the legislature. This is vital as the first step in forcing a downward trend upon all tax levying bodies in order to bring relief from unnecessary tax burdens.
2. Immediate consolidation and concentration of all existing commissions, boards and scattered functions of government, including the Public Service Commission, into not to exceed ten departments all directly accountable to the governor who in turn is directly responsible to the people for their conduct. This centralization of administrative responsibility is necessary in the setting up of a simple, economical and responsible method of handling the state's business.
3. Immediate, definite, equitable and certain plan for retiring the state's present overwhelming bonded indebtedness. Oppose submitting any further proposals for bond issues or appropriations at special elections.
4. Immediate insistence upon a show-down on the Japanese issue in Oregon. A white man cannot compete with a Japanese coolie and we have got to halt this insidious invasion of our lands and industries without further delay.
5. My mission as governor will be to stimulate progress in Oregon and promote the good name of popular government in our state.

To this end my earnest support will be given to the relief of our agricultural interests which must find encouragement through cooperative marketing and market roads, and to the development of our industries and natural resources upon which the state's welfare depend. My earnest support will likewise be given to the cause of public education upon which the state's moral and social welfare depends.
