NEW TRAIN SCHEDULE MONTAVILLE-TROUTDALE

A new train schedule has been arranged between Montavilla and Troutdale on the Portland Railway, Light and Power company lines. The change will become effective Sunday, July 23, 1922. The new schedule when it goes into effect will be as follows:

Trains leave Montavilla from the Mt. Hood depot for Troutdale daily at 6:15, 7:15, 8:20, 9:30, 10:40, 11:50 a. m.; 12:50, 1:50, 3:20, 4:30, 5:50, 6:55, 8:00, 9:00, 10:30, 11:45 p. m. There are two exceptions to this daily schedule. The train at 6:15 a. m. runs daily except Sunday and the train at 1:50 p. m. runs on Sunday only.

Trains leave Troutdale for Montavilla from the Mt. Hood depot daily at 5:40, 6:40, 7:45, 8:50, 10:05, 11:20 a. m.; 12:20, 2:50, 3:50, 5:10, 6:20, 7:30, 8:30, 9:30, 11:00 p. m. The train at 5:40 a. m. is the only exception to this rule. It goes daily except Sundays.

All the stations along the line between Montavilla and Troutdale will receive this extra train service as soon as it goes into effect. These stations are Multnomah Farm, Fairview, Ruby Junction, Linnemann Junction, Lents Junction and Golf Junction.

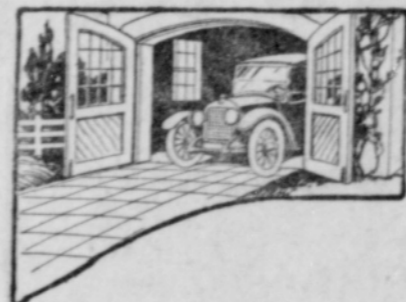
Several trains have been eliminated from the Portland to Troutdale schedule on the same line. On and after July 23, trains will leave First and Alder street station in Portland for Troutdale at 8:45 a. m., 1:45 p. m. and 3:45 p. m.
