have the Saunders aeroplane, which has been sailing over Gresham, take passengers on trips, starting from the field west of the fair grounds. The plane will also do some stunts over the grounds.

Harness racing begins Wednesday and continues each day of the fair. The track is in fine condition and the prospects are fine for good racing programs.

The Ladies' Symphony orchestra will be on the grounds afternoon and evening with programs. Running races begin Wednesday evening at 7 o'clock. Thursday evening, hurdle races will be given at 7 o'clock. Friday evening's race will be a relay and Saturday, running races will be given again in the evening. A steeple chase will be given Saturday afternoon which is something new here.

Chautauqua features have been arranged as follows: Robt. C. Wright will speak tonight (Tuesday) on the "Human Products of Our Schools" at the chautauqua tent.

Tomorrow noon Walter M. Pierce will speak at the fair grounds.

Thursday the W. C. T. U. will give an afternoon program and Friday evening the Parent-Teacher association will entertain with a program.

Friday the boys' and girls' clubs will have charge of entertainment features during the afternoon among which is a pageant, "Spirit of Home."

Wednesday is Gresham and Pioneer day.

Thursday, the big day of the fair, is Portland, Oregon Manufacturer's and Business Men's day. On this day the livestock parade will be held.

Friday is Fraternal day.

Saturday Patriotic day, and in the evening exhibitor's night.
