VOTERS QUESTION IS ANSWERED BY CLERK

The Outlook is in receipt of a letter, written under date of September 1 and signed by L. Witter and others, asking information concerning the special election to be held on September 6 to vote bonds for school purposes.

Since the questions involved are of great interest, not only to the writers of the letter but to every voter of the district, the Outlook takes pleasure in giving the best information available.

To Editor Outlook:—On the sixth of this month we will have an election to issue \$35,000 bonds to pay the floating indebtedness of Gresham Union High School No. 2.

We have to date voted \$20,000 and the end is not in sight. Would you kindly inform us the amount of bonds the school has out?

We voters would like to know how things are as on the 16th of September we will vote on \$20,000 water bonds. Going some, isn't it?

Dear Sir:—Your letter of September 1st to the editor of Gresham Outlook is before me and I am glad to have the opportunity of replying thereto.

The bond election to be held on the 6th inst. is a very important move on the part of the board of directors of the Union High School District as at the present time they have a floating indebtedness of \$35,000 consisting of outstanding teachers warrants and other general expense warrants issued for the running expenses of the high school, and a past due note of \$3,500, all of which draw interest at the rate of 6 per cent per annum.

The \$20,000 voted on July 24th will be used exclusively for the building of a new gymnasium and changing the old gymnasium into class rooms, which are absolutely a necessity if we want our high school to expand and grow, and I am sure that we all do as the high school is one of the best assets that Gresham has, and I will venture to say that if you are a property owner it has increased the value of your land 25 per cent within the past five years.

When this bond issue goes through the district will have a bonded indebtedness of \$60,000 with an assessed valuation of \$3,203,833.83 which is a very small indebtedness for a district of the size of ours.

A sinking fund has not been established but should be and it is up to the voters of this district to authorize the board to establish such a fund and vote a tax of a small amount in order to raise the amount.

We have never heard of a slush fund and you can rest assured that that board of directors are giving their time to this cause without one cent of remuneration in any manner, and believe me they have to give a great deal of their time.

Last Tuesday Mr. Lawrence and Dr. Botkin and H. F. Whilon spent the best part of the day going over the plans for the new gymnasium and next Wednesday the whole board will have to give up the entire afternoon and evening to this cause without one cent of pay.

They have the interest of the community at heart and are tax payers as well as you, so by voting "YES" on this bond issue you will be doing yourself a benefit and not increasing your burdens, as 5 1/2 per cent is much better than 6 per cent.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION.

Notice is hereby given that a special election will be held in the City of Gresham, Oregon, on the 16th day of September, 1922, at which there will be submitted to the legal voters of said City for their adoption or rejection the charter amendments hereinafter set forth, to-wit:

Resolution. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRESHAM, MULTNOMAH COUNTY, OREGON, that the following proposed amendments to the charter of said City be and the same hereby are proposed for submission to the legal voters of said City for their adoption or rejection at the special city election to be held on the 16th day of September, 1922, as in this resolution provided:

CHARTER AMENDMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE COUNCIL.

An Act. To amend an act entitled "An act to incorporate the Town of Gresham, in the County of Multnomah, Oregon, and to provide a charter therefor, and to repeal all acts or parts of acts in conflict therewith" filed in the office of the Secretary of State Feb. 11, 1905, as subsequently amended by the legal voters of the Town of Gresham at the special election duly called and held therein on the 18th day of September, 1911, and as subsequently amended by the legal voters thereof at the special election duly called and held therein on the 22d day of August, 1921, and to amend all other amendments thereto enacted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TOWN OF GRESHAM that an act entitled "An act to incorporate the Town of Gresham, in the County of Multnomah, Oregon, and to provide a charter therefor, and to repeal all acts or parts of acts in conflict therewith" filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 11, 1905, as subsequently amended by the legal voters of the Town of Gresham at the special election duly called and held therein on the 18th day of September, 1911, and as subsequently amended by the legal voters thereof at the special election duly called and held therein on the 27th day of May, 1912, and as subsequently amended by said legal voters at the special election duly called and held therein on the 22d day of August, 1921, and to amend all other amendments thereto enacted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people be and the same hereby is amended by adding thereto Chapter 14 to read as follows:

Chapter 14.

Section 1. For the purpose of providing funds for extending four-inch water mains to within five hundred feet of the following points, to-wit: East and west on Powell Valley Road to within 500 feet of the city limits; north on Main street to within 500 feet of the city limits; north on Cleveland avenue to within 500 feet of the city limits; south on South Roberts avenue to within 500 feet of the city limits; east on Lawrence street to within 500 feet of the city limits; north on Wallula Avenue from the Powell Valley Road to the Section Line Road and thence west on the Section Line Road for a distance of 1500 feet.

Section 2. The bonds hereby authorized shall be sold by the Common Council after advertisement thereof for at least ten (10) days in a newspaper published in Multnomah County, Oregon, to be designated by the Council.

Section 3. The debt limitations contained in the charter of said city shall not apply to the bonds hereby authorized.

Section 4. The Common Council shall each year at the time of making the annual tax levy for city purposes include in such levy a sum sufficient to pay interest due on the outstanding bonds of this issue and to retire the principal thereof at maturity.

RESOLVED FURTHER that this resolution for proposed charter amendments submitted to the voters by the Council be filed with the Recorder of the City of Gresham for submission to the legal voters of said city for their rejection or approval to be voted upon at a special election to be held as herein provided:

RESOLVED FURTHER that the Common Council deems it advisable and does hereby and herein call and make necessary provision for the holding of a special election which shall be and hereby is called to be held on the 16th day of September, 1922.

CHARTER AMENDMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE COUNCIL.

An Act. To amend the charter of the City of Gresham filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 11, 1905, and as subsequently amended at the special city elections held on September 18, 1911, May 27, 1912, and August 22, 1921, by adding thereto Chapter 14 providing for an issue of not to exceed \$20,000 bonds of said city for the purpose of making extensions and additions to the present four-inch water mains and for the levy of a special tax to pay principal and interest thereon.
