POSTOFFICE BUILDINGS PLANNED

Uncle Sam may invest in real estate in Gresham as soon as the plan of Postmaster General Work is authorized by congress. It is proposed that the government buy or build its own postoffice building.

President Harding is said to have approved the plan. It is national in scope and when put into operation will save the government \$500,000,000 in ten years.

Postmaster General Work in his letter to President Harding explained that the department now pays an annual rental for buildings which house all of our postoffices, totaling more than \$12,000,000. These figures have been growing at a tremendous rate recently as leases expired and owners demand and obtained substantial increases.

It was also pointed out that shameless speculation on the part of those who try to prey on the government will be abolished for all time.

The government can borrow money at 4 per cent to buy or build postoffices, which will be tax free, says Work. Whereas, when leased, the government pays a rental high enough to permit the lessor to borrow money at 7 to 8 per cent and still profit.

Nearly six thousand of Uncle Sam's postoffices are in leased quarters. Only 1,200 are in homes owned by the government.

The parcel post and other adjustments have resulted in earnings which have more than doubled in the last ten years and are constantly growing.

Administration leaders in congress favor the plan and treasury officials have expressed the opinion that it is essential to economical management of the postal system.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION.

Notice is hereby given that a special election will be held in the City of Gresham, Oregon, on the 16th day of September, 1922, at which there will be submitted to the legal voters of said City for their adoption or rejection the charter amendments hereinafter set forth, to-wit:

Resolution. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRESHAM, MULTNOMAH COUNTY, OREGON, that the following proposed amendments to the charter of said City be and the same hereby are proposed for submission to the legal voters of said City for their adoption or rejection at the special city election to be held on the 16th day of September, 1922, as in this resolution provided: CHARTER AMENDMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE COUNCIL.

An Act. To amend an act entitled "An act to incorporate the Town of Gresham, in the County of Multnomah, Oregon, and to provide a charter therefor, and to repeal all acts or parts of acts in conflict therewith" filed in the office of the Secretary of State Feb. 11, 1905, as subsequently amended by the legal voters of the Town of Gresham at the special election duly called and held therein on the 18th day of September, 1911, and as subsequently amended by the legal voters thereof at the special election duly called and held therein on the 27th day of May, 1912, and as subsequently amended by said legal voters at the special election duly called and held therein on the 22d day of August, 1921, and to amend all other amendments thereto enacted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TOWN OF GRESHAM that an act to incorporate the Town of Gresham, in the County of Multnomah, Oregon, and to provide a charter therefor, and to repeal all acts or parts of acts in conflict therewith" filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 11, 1905, as subsequently amended by the legal voters of the Town of Gresham at the special election duly called and held therein on the 18th day of September, 1911, and as subsequently amended by the legal voters thereof at the special election duly called and held therein on the 27th day of May, 1912, and as subsequently amended by said legal voters at the special election duly called and held therein on the 22d day of August, 1921, and as amended by all other amendments thereto enacted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people be and the same hereby is amended by adding thereto Chapter 14 to read as follows: Chapter 14.

Section 1. For the purpose of providing funds for extending four-inch water mains to within five hundred feet of the following points, to-wit:

East and west on Powell Valley Road to within 500 feet of the city limits; north on Main street to within 500 feet of the city limits; north on Cleveland avenue to within 500 feet of the city limits; south on South Hobbs avenue to within 500 feet of the city limits; east on Lawrence street to within 500 feet of the city limits; north on Wadlala avenue from the Powell Valley Road to the Section Line Road and thence west on the Section Line Road for a distance of 1500 feet.

The Common Council of the City of Gresham, Oregon, is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and dispose of general obligation bonds of said City in an amount not to exceed twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000), said bonds to be in denominations of \$500 or \$1,000 each, to be signed by the mayor and countersigned by the recorder under the corporate seal of the city, having semi-annual interest coupons attached thereto bearing the fac-simile engraved signature of the Mayor and Recorder, whereby the city shall be held in substance and effect to undertake and promise to pay the bearer of each of said bonds at maturity thereof the sum named therein in gold coin of the United States of the present standard of value with interest thereon in like gold coin at the rate of not to exceed five and one-half per cent (5 1/2%) per annum, payable semi-annually, said bonds to be dated at a convenient time to be fixed by the Council, maturity or maturities to be likewise fixed by the Council, but not to exceed twenty (20) years from date, principal and interest of said bonds to be payable at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York City, which bonds shall be known as "City of Gresham Water Extension Bonds, Series 1922."

Section 2. The bonds hereby authorized shall be sold by the Common Council after advertisement thereof for at least ten (10) days in a newspaper published in Multnomah County, Oregon, to be designated by the Council.

Section 3. The debt limitations contained in the charter of said city shall not apply to the bonds hereby authorized.

Section 4. The Common Council shall each year at the time of making the annual tax levy for city purposes include in such levy a sum sufficient to pay interest due on the outstanding bonds of this issue and to retire the principal thereof at maturity.

RESOLVED FURTHER that this resolution for proposed charter amendments submitted to the voters by the Council be filed with the Recorder of the City of Gresham for submission to the legal voters of said city for their rejection or approval to be voted upon at a special election to be held as herein provided:

RESOLVED FURTHER that the Common Council deems it advisable and does hereby and herein call and make necessary provision for the holding of a special election which shall be and hereby is called to be held on the 16th day of September, 1922, between the legal voting hours on said date, and that said time be and the same hereby is designated as

An Act. To amend the charter of the city of Gresham filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 11, 1905, and as subsequently amended at the special city elections held on September 18, 1911, May 27, 1912, and August 22, 1921, by adding thereto Chapter 14 providing for an issue of not to exceed \$20,000 bonds of said city for the purpose of making extensions and additions to the present four-inch water mains and for the levy of a special tax to pay principal and interest thereon. 100—Yes. 101—No.
