Additional Building Activities.

A community hall has just been completed at a cost of \$5100. The dimensions are 40 x 84 feet with 14 foot ceiling. There is a roomy stage and dressing rooms. It is plastered and has a first class dancing floor. The concrete basement will have a room for the public library and the city council chamber. E. G. Rohlf, of Troutdale had the contract and completed the work very satisfactorily. O. Adams of Gresham did the plastering.

The M. E. church through the efforts of the pastor, Rev. Mr. Smith, has been remodeled and lowered onto a concrete foundation and when completed will contain the auditorium upstairs and a diningroom, kitchen and rest room in the basement.

A. Leland has remodeled and painted the interior of the building he recently purchased for his meat market, making a very neat looking shop. He has added an electric sausage grinder to his equipment.

Fox Bros. have put in a cement sidewalk in front of their house occupied by J. Nysmith. J. A. Hard Times Card Party.

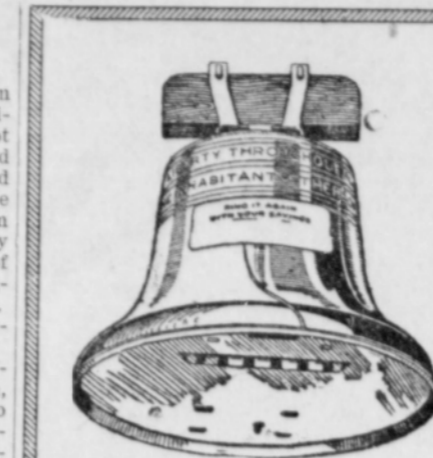

New Homes in Troutdale.

The new Lee Evans home is being built west of Troutdale on Columbia highway. When completed it promises to be one of the most attractive and up-to-date houses in Troutdale. The building is 35x62. The outside is practically complete and the finishing inside is now under way. H. E. Bramhall is doing the work alone with only occasional extra help. The large, spacious living room is 15 feet, 10 inches wide and 26 feet, 7 inches long. Built-in bookcases and a fireplace will add much to its attractiveness. The floors in the living room and diningroom will be of hardwood. The diningroom will have a built-in buffet. The kitchen and bathroom will have all of the usual built-in features. A breakfast room and three bedrooms complete the list of rooms downstairs.

The walls in all of the rooms will be finished in plaster board as it will not crack like the plaster. The basement will be equipped with a pipeless furnace and a laundry room. There are to be three porches, two corner ones 10 x 16 and a front porch 6 x 12. The cost of the completed house is expected to be between \$7000 and \$8000. A new garage 30 feet wide and 40 feet long is to be built later.

James Cook, who owns the garage near the upper Sandy bridge has made considerable improvements on his house which is located near the garage.
