mountain heavy fog banks were hiding the summit of Mt. Hood, and were beginning to send their vanguard, a cold misty breeze, to tell us that we had selected an unfavorable day for a successful visit to the summit of Oregon's king of mountains.

Soon everybody was covered with mist, but when about a mile further on other things attracted the attention. First someone said: "Phoo! what smells so funny?" It was sulphur fumes from Crater Rock, which we were leaving at our left.

In the meantime a rocky ledge was scaled and our eyes beheld a genuine glacier. To us it did not seem to differ very much from the snowfield which was now behind us, except for great fissures, showing ice of an immense thickness. Clem called this the White River glacier. In a short while we reached a small ice cave and here, sheltered from fog and breeze, each received a slice of pineapple from the guide.

It surely felt comfortable to spread out on the moist rocks and gravel after hiking over five hours. About 15 minutes was all the time the leader could spare for resting; too much rest would make one feel stiff in the points, as he put it. Something new lay in store for the novice.

When the ascent had taken a full side hour, the descent was made in an hour and forty minutes by most of the party. A hearty lunch with hot coffee tasted mighty good, it being the first regular lunch since early the night before.
