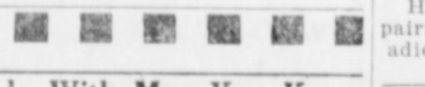
The regular services will be held next Sunday at the Methodist church. Sunday school will be at 10 in the morning and preaching at 11.

FARM RETURNS ARE OUT OF BALANCE

According to data compiled by the Bureau of Agricultural Economics of the United States Department of Agriculture, the index of purchasing power of farm products in terms of other commodities stood at 64 for August, as compared with 69 in July and 72 in June.

This means that the buying power of a unit of farm products is down to practically the lowest point reached since the war, the index being 62 in December, 1921. The disparity in prices between products that farmers sell and industrial products which they have to buy, does not lessen. At present it is growing greater.

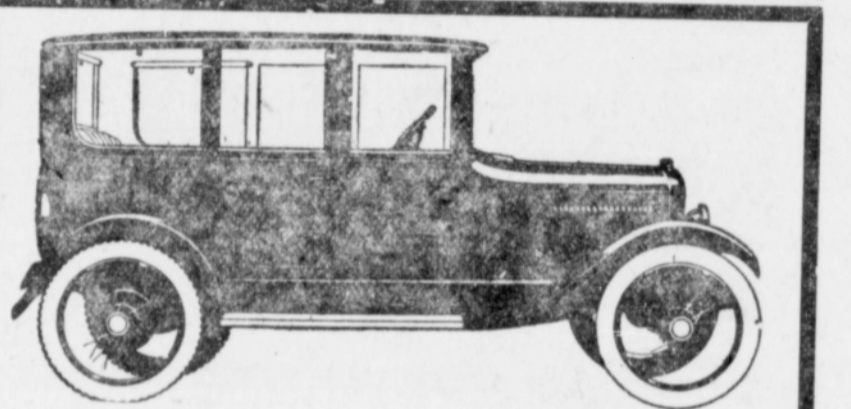

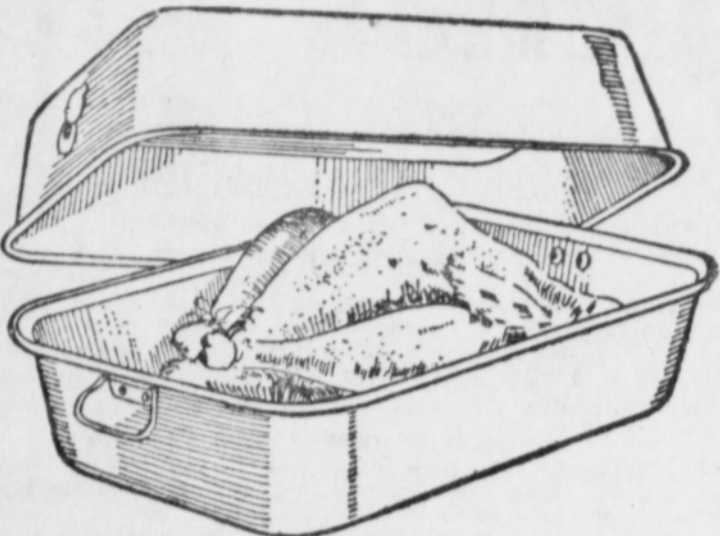
