There were 120 present on Wednesday at the "Health for the Adult" program held in the grange hall. Miss Margery M. Smith told her hearers to "eat more prunes" during her talk in which she advised her hearers to eat wisely and live a little longer.

Leo Rice, M.D., of Portland, was to have spoken on "Keeping Physically Fit" but for some reason did not get here.

"The world is going so rapidly now that relaxation is almost foreign in the homes of today" was the statement made by Wm. House, M.D., neuro psychiatrist of Portland during his address on "Fatigue."

Miss Emma F. Heilman, director of physical education for women at Reed College spoke on shoes and posture. She explained the straightening out of the child's spinal column as the spine is completely curved from the head to the base before the child can walk.

Miss Mary P. Billmeyer told of the work of the county health nurse. She told how her duties have increased since she first came to this county until now it is impossible for her to cover the county in the way it should be done.

When asked what he advised the farmers to plant, Mr. Fisher said there should be more strawberries and gooseberries in this district as there seems to be plenty of orders for them. While the market for strawberries was not very firm this past year, there is always a good demand for the fresh fruit.

C. B. Lewis advised his hearers never to try anything new when planning farm crops as it is too expensive. Let the experiment station do the experimenting was his advice.

There was one point upon which all of the speakers agreed which was that this part of Oregon is the ideal spot for the growing of small fruits. There is said to be only two other states besides Oregon and Washington in which raspberries can be grown successfully and they are Minnesota and New York state and the quality grown in Oregon is superior to those grown in the last named.
