**FOOD SPECIALIST TALKS AT UNION**

Miss Marjorie Smith of the O. A. C. Extension Service gave the third of her six lectures at the new Union schoolhouse on Friday, March 16. About thirty were present.

Miss Smith's subject was "Constipation, Its Causes and Correction." She laid the blame of this distressing condition to the wrong kind of food; taken in too large amounts and irregularly, and to a lack of the proper exercise. She decried drugs, which tear down the system and do not build it up and advised plenty of pure water, a diet of vegetables, fruits and whole grains, sufficient out-door exercise, cheerfulness and proper methods of eating.

In connection with the subject Miss Smith gave the following recipe for the agar agar dessert, a delicious and healthful concoction: two tablespoons agar agar, cut fine; three cups water or fruit juice. Put in one cup water and bring to boil. Drain and add juice and fruit, one-third cup lemon juice to three-fourths cup sugar. Let harden like jello. Serve with whipped cream. To form a salad, vegetables can be used in place of fruit.

The next lecture will take place on Wednesday, April 11, at 2 p. m., at the schoolhouse, on the subject "The Growing Child and Feeding for Teeth."

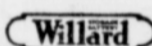
